Students will access the courses from their schools, either in a structured class environment or on a self-study basis. Instructors may also permit access from home. "The system is designed so that anyone with a minimum of a 200 MHz computer, 56k modem and 5.0 browser can participate," explains Bryan McCool, Director of Information Technology. "One of the exceptional features of these web-based courses is the convenient tutor support available to students. A student with a question can simply click on the 'tutor' button at any time to email a qualified instructor. This feature provides the 'human touch,'" says McCool.

In addition to basic electrical/electronic courses, Melior has web-based modules supporting tools such as MicroVat, MT 2500 Heritage, MTG 2500 Color Graphing Scanner, Vantage, and soon will offering training on Snap-on's new MODIS diagnostic tool. Melior's web-based courses are available to technicians across the industry at <u>www.melioronline.com</u> and are sponsored by the Automotive Service Association (ASA) and the Service Technician's Society (STS).
