The car's coachwork was designed by LeBaron, and even today is regarded as a landmark example of good automotive design. One of a handful of examples remaining.

1962 Bentley S2 Saloon - Designed as the sporting counterpart to Roll-Royce, Bentleys were frighteningly expensive, but offered unparalleled refinement, performance, and beauty. The low mileage original example offered here among the most desirable - a left drive, factory air-conditioned car with a well documented owner history.
