

Extreme Building Overhaul For Award-Winning Limousine Fleet

But building from a preexisting, time-weathered structure was a challenge that few builders could tackle.

The company was growing exponentially and, in order to accommodate the growth, needed a larger, up-to-date facility. After researching his options, Mollica had found an old 66,000 square foot hat box production facility that was the perfect fit for his successful limousine company. It was cavernous, ideally situated, and cost-effective for his needs. But it was in a state of disrepair. And the problems with the structure were beyond the capabilities of most builders. From the leaking roof to the unsuitable steel columns, the need for a specialist was evident.

"You should have seen this place," Mollica recalls. "It was a fantastic location; perfect for a limousine business because it was near the highway. But the downside was that it needed a complete makeover. We needed a builder that was familiar with extreme building overhauls."

Starting from a pre-existing structure often proves to be a more cost-effective solution than building a new facility, as was the case with the Black Tie Limousine facility. After deciding that building a new facility wasn't the best solution for his business, Mollica turned his attention to finding specialized builders that could handle the complexities of working on revitalizing pre-existing structures.

"We found Dutton & Garfield and knew that, as a <u>Butler Builder®</u>, they could handle the intricacies of this major renovation project," Mollica said. "Having a structurally sound facility was crucial to me, especially with 41 extremely expensive automobiles within its walls."

MR-24® roof system is its exclusive Pittsburgh double-lock standing seam. The edges of the seam are folded over twice to eliminate leaks, even under the harshest of conditions. Additionally, the roof has special energy saving thermal blocks to prevent heat loss in the 66,000 square foot facility.

Having the peace of mind knowing that even under the most extreme conditions, Black Tie Limousine's facility would stand up to the test is a source of great relief for Mollica, because he understands the need for a sturdy structure. During the Blizzard of 1993, the garage roof of his 3,000 square foot industrial condominium collapsed under the weight of the snow, jeopardizing his limousine business.

Years later, as a result of hard work, impeccable service, and the vision to take an old hat box production facility and turn it into a first-class business, Mollica was named Limo Digest's 2010 Large Operator of the Year. He now has a weathertight roof and energy efficient steel structure to house and protect 41 limousines, including a white 1960 Rolls Royce once owned by actor Nicolas Cage. Business has never been better.

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
