Buy Winter Tires

Remember that driving safely is different in the winter than in the summer, and to avoid traffic tickets bear in mind that police may hand out a careless driving ticket more readily and may not easily accept poor road conditions as an excuse for sliding through a stop sign. It's up to every driver to take road conditions into account and make an effort to avoid letting them become a factor in poor winter driving.

Keep Things Clean and Maintained

Keeping car windows and headlights clean is always important, but it's even more important in the winter when visibility is often already reduced by blowing snow. Maintaining things on the vehicle is also important, including ensuring all headlights, taillights, brake lights and turn signal lights are working properly so that other drivers will be able to see the car and anticipate the driver's moves.

It's also vital to make sure the car has the right windshield fluid and anti-freeze to ensure it is running properly and the driver can see and proceed safely. Keep up on regular tune-ups as well so that a sudden breakdown doesn't cause a potential accident.

Don't Drink and Drive



Drinking and driving is always a bad idea, but during the winter months, especially around the holidays, it becomes a particularly dangerous and all too common problem. Driving while intoxicated may well be the worst winter driving mistake any driver can make.
