Vehicles in this display must still have roll bar or roll cage and must have raced in FIA, IMSA, SCCA or one of the acknowledged vintage racing organizations. There will be a designated parking area for all pre-registered Corvette race cars. Significant Corvette race car drivers will also be on hand as special guests.

This year's Chip's Choice will feature Greenwood Corvettes. There will also be a Greenwood Reunion display as part of the Fun Display show field. John Greenwood built racing and street Corvettes based on his experience with his own cars. He offered different kinds of body, chassis and engine parts, such as wide bodies, wings and turbo-charged engines. John's sons Tim and Joe Greenwood continue to offer new Corvette body pieces.

The Corvettes at Carlisle Benefit Auction this year will support Amyloid research. Carlisle Events' co-owner Chip Miller has donated his pristine 1957 Corvette for auction. He hopes that others who have Amyloidosis will be diagnosed more quickly and have more options for treatment.
