

Inventor Develops Enhanced Snow-Removal Equipment (TOR-9809)

InventHelp, founded in 1984 in Pittsburgh, is attempting to submit this idea, the Snow Gone, to applicable companies for their consideration.

PITTSBURGH, PA (PRWEB) December 01, 2017 -- "I was personally frustrated by high snow banks along the sides of roads, streets and driveways, as they slow a city or a town down," said an inventor from Brampton, Ontario, Canada. "I thought that there had to be a more efficient way to clear snow than conventional snow plows."

He developed the SNOW GONE to provide an efficient way to clear snow from roadways. The equipment prevents high snow banks from piling up along the sides of the road. It eliminates the need to wait for snow to melt in order to clear the area. The vehicle ends the process of using a dump truck or back hoe to remove snow banks. The invention allows traffic to flow more smoothly, which is designed to enhance roadway safety. Additionally, it increases productivity for area businesses.

The original design was submitted to the Toronto office of InventHelp. It is currently available for licensing or sale to manufacturers or marketers.
