In addition, families will have the opportunity to participate in many great activities including: Police, Fire, and Emergency Preparedness information, children's fingerprinting, face coloring, an interactive bike and pedestrian safety obstacle course by SAFE Moves, free health screening provided by AltaMed, and the Radio Disney Street Team will be there playing all of today's hit tunes and Disney s classics.

Since 2000, State Farm has hosted events at more than 500 sites and has inspected 18,600 child seats. Last year's Safety Day was in 9 locations across California, with more than 350 child and booster seats checked. Just 6 percent of the seats reviewed passed inspection.

involves The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia and the University of Pennsylvania, is the first comprehensive investigation of how and why children are killed or injured in vehicle crashes. Report findings of the Partners for Child Passenger Safety report include:

·Eighty-two percent of car seats are misused in some way. The most common mistakes are failing to attach the seat tightly to the vehicle; failing to fasten the harness tightly around the child; and using the chest clip incorrectly.

·Children who ride unrestrained are three times more likely to sustain significant injury in a crash when compared with children who are restrained.

·Children riding in the back seats of compact "extended cab" pickup trucks are nearly three times as likely to be hurt in a crash as children in the back seats of other vehicles.

"I applaud State Farm and the California Highway Patrol for partnering to raise community awareness about the importance of child safety. I highly encourage the community to take part in Child Safety Day."
