5th Annual Greater Los Angeles Soap Box Derby Race is the Largest sanctioned "OfficialRace" in Los Angeles County. To be held on May 29th in La Canada Flintridge, CA

The Soap Box Derby is a youth racing program which has run nationally since 1934. The race will be run on Michigan Hill in La Canada Flintridge and starts at 8 a.m. and continues until all races have been run.
