According to Michael, there are still several small details that need to be completed such as cleaning and polishing all of the chrome and aluminum on the truck, getting the graphics applied and ironing out a few mechanical issues.

The project began with a 1987 Ford F-250 which had seen the end of its useful service life and was transformed into a monstrous fire fighting machine. With a plethora of lights, sirens and air horns along with being lifted up on big tires and a beefy suspension, it is definitely a sight to see.
