

CHP's Spike Helmick Viciously Attacked

California Highway Patrol Commissioner Spike Helmick has been viciously attacked.

(<u>PRWEB</u>) October 13, 2004 -- CHP Commissioner Spike Helmick, who was forced to resign his post amid fraud accusations, was viciously attacked monday morning.

Former Commissioner Helmick was shown the door by Governor Schwarzenegger, after attempting to defraud the State of California by seeking a disability pension he was not entitled to through worker's compensation.

Helmick filed a claim for falling out of his chair at work, and has since rescinded the claim.
