In January 1999, the Thousand Oaks Auto Mall began supporting six cash starved local elementary schools by pledging quarterly donations for extras such as books, computer-assisted reading programs and to furnish computers for each classroom. Employees are also paid their hourly wage to volunteer at local elementary schools on a variety of projects, from reading to students to assisting with homework. Dealers continue to pay regular visits to the schools and are proud to be able to contribute to such positive changes in the lives of local children. The stories include students helped by homework clubs that would not otherwise have existed, new computer labs and a talented young girl who was able to pursue her love of music.

"Some of our parents work two to three jobs to support their children and do not have the time or means to raise the tens and in some cases hundreds of thousands of dollars available to other PTAs. The funds from Thousand Oaks Auto Mall have enabled us to hire a computer teacher, teach kids how to use a computer, purchase additional computers and support our computer lab. Without them, these programs would not exist," said Beverly Eidmann, Manzanita Elementary School principal.

The Thousand Oaks Auto Mall currently supports six Title One elementary schools in the Conejo Valley: Walnut, Conejo, Park Oaks, Manzanita, Glenwood and Acacia.

To help celebrate the occasion, the Thousand Oaks Auto Mall and the schools are throwing a party to celebrate how well the schools have used this gift to improve educational standards.
