 $\hat{A} \square$ The holiday season is supposed to be a time for family, friends, and festive celebrations, but it is unfortunately also a time when we see a tragic jump in the number of alcohol-related highway fatalities, $\hat{A} \square$ said Tarrant Council Executive Director Eric Niedermayer. $\hat{A} \square$ That $\hat{A} \square$ s why we are reminding everyone this holiday season, if you catch a buzz, catch a ride. $\hat{A} \square$

Nationally, more than 17,000 people died in alcohol-related highway crashes during 2003. Every 30 minutes, nearly 50 times a day, someone in America dies in an alcohol-related crash. Hundreds of thousands more are injured each year. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), alcohol played a part in 47 percent of all traffic-related deaths in the state of Texas last year, compared to 41 percent for the nation. Tarrant County had the highest percentage of alcohol-related traffic deaths at 55 percent.

 $\hat{A} \square$ Designating a sober driver before the party begins is just one of several, simple steps to remember to help avoid a tragic crash or an arrest for impaired driving, $\hat{A} \square$ Niedermayer said, while offering these other simple reminders for a safer holiday season:

 $\hat{A} \Box Don \hat{A} \Box t$ even think about getting behind the wheel if you $\hat{A} \Box$ ve been out drinking;

 $\hat{A} \square$ If you are impaired, call a taxi $\hat{A} \square$ use mass transit $\hat{A} \square$ or get a sober friend or family member to come and get you;

 $\hat{A} \Box Or$ just stay where you are and sleep it off until you are sober;

 $\hat{A} \square$ And remember $\hat{A} \square$ Friends Don $\hat{A} \square$ t Let Friends Drive Drunk. Take the keys and never let a friend leave your sight if you think they are about to drive while impaired.

 $\hat{A} \Box$ Driving impaired or riding with someone who is impaired is simply not worth the risk, $\hat{A} \Box$ Niedermayer said. $\hat{A} \Box$ The consequences are serious and real. Not only do you risk killing yourself or someone else, but the trauma and financial costs of a crash or an arrest for driving while impaired can be really significant and not the way you want to spend your holiday season. $\hat{A} \Box$
