

Build a Bike GTR Club Project



Our current club project is 1/12 scale motorcycles, either the new Revell chopper bikes which are on the store shelves now, or a Tamiya motorcycle if you cannot bear to do a chopper. Kitbashing or modifying the kits is encouraged so we can see how many variations or themes our members can come up with. So start building a bike in time to show it at the February meeting. Previous club projects have lead to slim participation; hopefully we can get more kits built this time around. Check out *Model Cars* magazine, #117, for a review, customizing tips and a build up article on the Revell 1/12 chopper kits we are doing for our club Build a Bike project.

Bike Build Update

In looking at the Revell chopper kits that have been built and that are in progress, the issue of not gluing the front fork into the mount on the frame prior to painting (in order to be able to paint the frame!) seems to be one that most builders are still figuring out. So I would like to share what I have tried on my chopper kit.

After cutting out the center mounting post on the front fork, I drilled out holes on the top and bottom of the fork mounts, where the post had been attached. Make the holes rather small as the hole in the soft plastic will eventually expand.

Then I went to the hobby shop, and looked at the hardware in the model railroad section. Since the tops of the screws used to reattach the fork and allow it to pivot will be visible, especially on top, I chose a brass hex head machine screw, sold in a pack of 12 by Walthers, size 2-56, 3/8", part #947-1155. I would have preferred a longer nut then use a bolt on the bottom, but this particular shop did have anything longer. So instead of securing with a nut, I will put screws on both top and bottom, and since I am painting the fork the brass will be covered. But a nice machined hex head screw, just a touch bigger than the ones molded into the head, will show on the top when completed.



There is a bit of play in the fit, since the screws are not as wide as the plastic post that was removed, but use some plastic sprue in the mounting hole to shim. I plan to use the short fork in the soft tail frame instead of the long fork, so if I put a shim on the front of the post on top and on the rear of the bottom I can adjust the angle of the fork as well as tighten the fit.

Besides mounting the fork, I think I will sand off the molded on hex head bolts on the top of the fork, cut off the thread on the brass screws then glue that on for sharper detail.

This is one way to address this, I am sure that in February on Project night we will see some alternative solutions.

Ken Zinnen: his 1/12 chopper kit in progress, with a reshaped gas tank, rear fender mods and seat upgrade.





Book Review: Classic Citroens

Subject: The Classic Citroens 1935-75

Author: John Reynolds McFarland & Company, 2006 By Chuck Herrmann



While never a big favorite of American auto fans, the French Citroen brand was and still is a major player in the international automotive industry. This book, 274 pages with lots of B&W photos, covers what the author feels was the peak period of Citroen, when their best known models were designed and produced.

During the years covered by this book, Citroen was owned and managed by the management of the Michelin tire company. The author feels that this lead to the development of three classic models that were successful due to their design and engineering.

- Traction Avant 1934-57, the biggest selling car in France and the model that revived French auto industry after WWII
- 2CV 1948-90, the economy car that kept coming back and became an icon, the "French Beetle" which ended up selling 6,956,895 units.
- DS 1955-75 replaced the Avant as the standard French sedan, contemporary aerodynamic shape, hydro pneumatic self leveling suspension, FWD, featured steel belted radials.

Once Citroen was sold to Automobiles Peugeot in 1976, the author feels that these innovative, unique designs were replaced by more conservative models utilizing technology and design philosophy shared with Peugeot.

The book also includes a detailed appendix with details on models and technical specs.


Modelers may find this book useful as reference material. There have been several models of the Citroens covered here; Heller did a 2CV in 1/24 which I have built, one of their better kits. They also did it in 1/43, as well as a DS 19. Tamiya does a 1/24 2CV, and I have a die cast late model Traction Avant in 1/24 by Burago.

Subject: Better Batteries

If you are looking for a more detailed stock battery than the generic kit supplied pieces, or if you want a more detailed piece for a hot rod or street machine project, the aftermarket has responded. The Better Battery is available, a resin molded battery along with wire for posts and decals. The molding is clean and sharp, you get three batteries in each kit for a retail price of \$5.00. This is a nice accessory that can help finish off your detailed engine bay.



I picked up my sample at the Rockford show last January. It had been on my bench since, but as I went to finish up this article, I couldn't find it! Thus, I am lacking some information. I believe this is produced by JK Castings, which is located somewhere in Wisconsin. The beauty of the auto modeling aftermarket is that thanks to some modern technologies all sorts of stuff that would normally be of limited interest may be available. Here are some decals from a home based source.

Corvette LeMans/Daytona Pace Cars

Predecorated kits allow for easier build ups since you need not paint, but often the markings supplied with such kits are not very good. Such was the case when Revell issued a Pro Finish kit of the then new Corvette C-5, which was the pace car or safety car for both classic 24 Hour enduarance races in 1999, the Rolex 24 at Daytona and the LeMans 24 Hours in France.



The kit came pre painted in two colors, the red and white with checkered flag

graphics. But the lettering was not a waterslide decal, but some stickers. As stickers go, they were not too bad but now there are waterslide decals available. They would also be useful for other service or emergency vehicles that need the Daytona, Rolex, LeMans or ACO markings on this sheet.



Blue Beetle

Sometimes you find an old kit at a swap meet or on E-Bay, or in your stash, and the decals are aged or missing. This sheet of decals is for the old Monogram Blue beetle custom, which is not easy to find but if you do it will likely have decal issues. This small sheet is a replacement for the kit sheet. Or it may be useful if you have a project calling for some 50's era hot rod markings.
