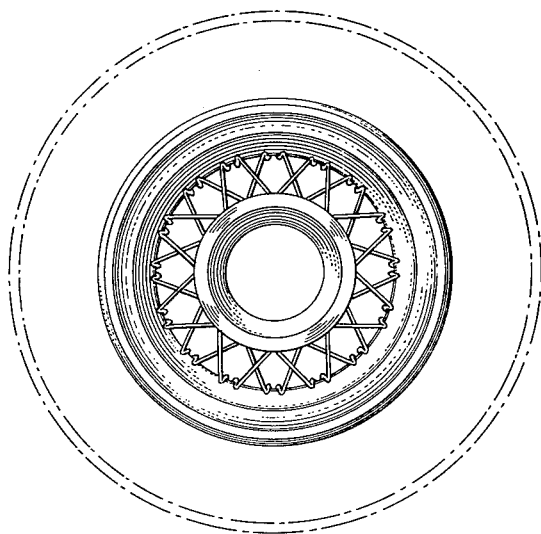

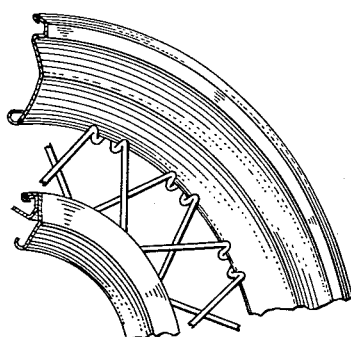

Fig. 1 is a side elevational view of a wheel trim embodying my new design;

Fig. 2 is a profile view showing generally the cross sectional contour of the wheel trim of Fig. 1; and

Fig. 3 is a fragmentary perspective view thereof.

The dot and dash line showing of a conventional tire and wheel assembly in Figs. 1 and 2 is for illustrative purposes only.

The characteristic feature of my design for the wheel trim disclosed resides in the configuration of the radially outer portions of the spokes as shown at the inner periphery of the outer ring portion of the wheel trim.

I claim:

The ornamental design for a wheel trim, substantially as shown and described.
