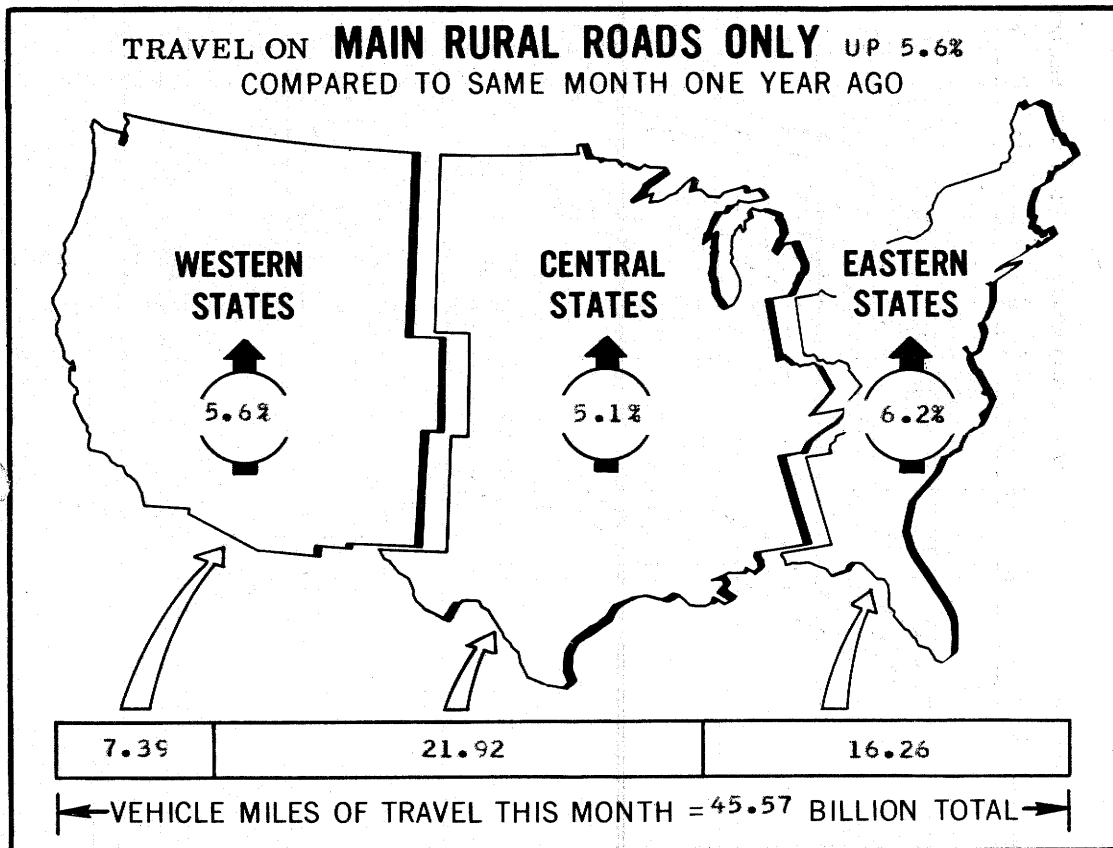

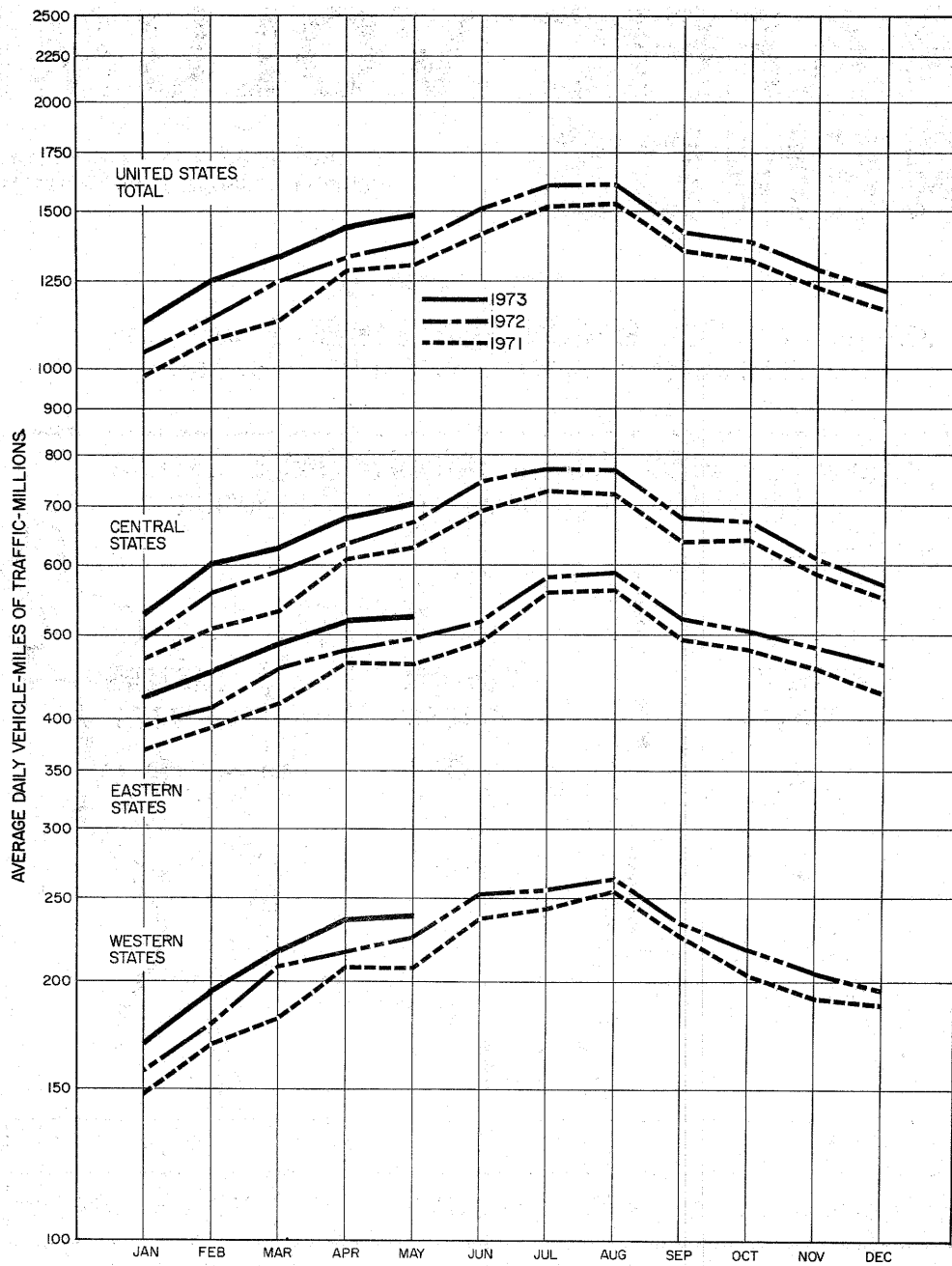


FIGURE 1- TRAVEL ON MAIN RURAL ROADS, BY MONTHS

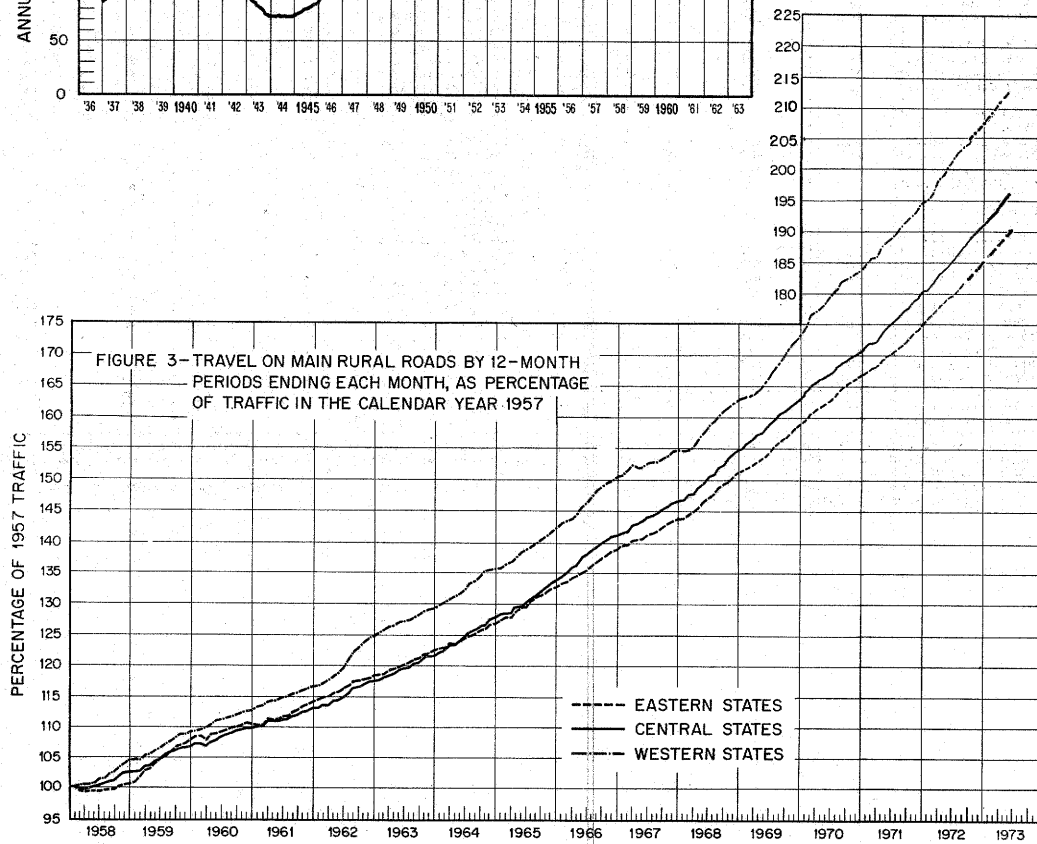
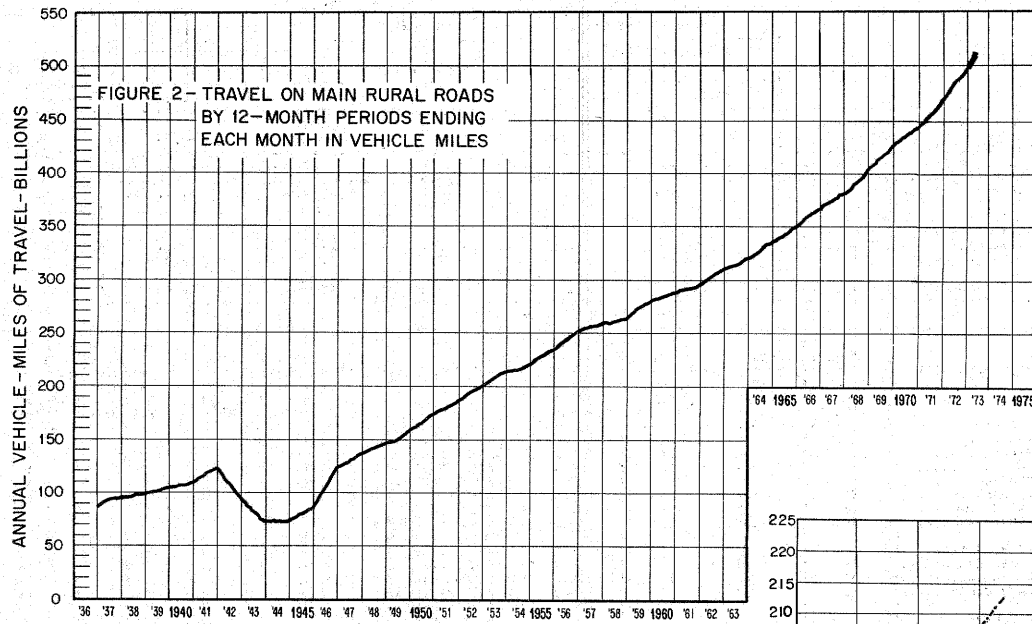
