We are pleased to present the Federal Fleet Report for fiscal year 2003. This is the fifth year that the report has been produced through the Federal Automotive Statistical Tool (FAST), an Internet-based system that collects fleet data from Federal agencies to satisfy several distinct reporting requirements for the General Services Administration, the Department of Energy, and the Energy Information Agency.

This year, the report was produced within our target time period of four months after the close of the fiscal year. This is the earliest the Fleet Report has been available since its inception in 1950. The improved timeliness of the Report has significantly enhanced its value. We will continue enhancements to the Federal Fleet Report this year that will provide more helpful information, more valuable comparisons, and eliminate duplicate or valueless information.

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FISCAL YEAR 2003 FEDERAL FLEET REPORT INTRODUCTION

OVERVIEW

Federal departments and agencies and their contractors use motor vehicles to perform their missions. Vehicles are obtained from three primary sources: purchase, commercial lease, and lease from GSA Fleet. This report presents the inventory, utilization, cost, and fuel use associated with this large fleet of vehicles. Data are summarized by civilian, military, and Postal Service; as well as domestic, foreign, and worldwide. Tables of data, charts that display the data graphically, and trends are included as well.

Privately owned vehicles used by employees on official business are not included; neither are short-term commercial rentals (less than 60 days). Special purpose vehicles are also excluded from this Report.

DATA COLLECTION

This report summarizes data reported by Federal agencies in the Federal Automotive Statistical Tool (FAST), an internet-based reporting platform, which replaced the old Standard Form 82, *Agency Report of Motor Vehicle Data*. It also includes data reported by GSA's Office of Vehicle Acquisition and Leasing Services, which includes both GSA Fleet and GSA Automotive. GSA Fleet is the component of GSA that manages a fleet of non-tactical vehicles for use by other Federal agencies and their contractors; GSA Automotive is the office that writes vehicle specifications and contracts for the purchase of non-tactical motor vehicles on behalf of all Federal activities.

As in previous editions of this report, fleet data for the General Services Administration is displayed in various ways, depending on the table or chart. In some cases, GSA reports on the vehicles it uses to perform its mission; in other cases GSA data reflect its function as a fleet service provider to other agencies, much like a commercial leasing company. Consequently, entries for GSA sometimes show a fleet of over 175,000 vehicles, with corresponding miles traveled and fuel used; and at other times GSA's vehicles, miles, and fuel use are distributed among the agencies by which the vehicles are used.

All agencies are required to report vehicle inventory and commercial leasing information. Large fleets (over 2,000 vehicles) are also required to report on cost, mileage, and fuel used; small agencies may report these data voluntarily, in which case they are also included in this report. The determination that a fleet is large or small depends on the management structure within the agency; consequently, a single agency may have multiple fleets, including large, small, or both. In fiscal year 2003 there are 22 large and 28 small fleets represented in this report.

This year, the FAST system started collection of motor vehicle data previously reported under Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Circular A-11, Exhibit 33. Although current inventory and cost data was reported directly to OMB for this reporting period, forecast inventory and cost data was collected through FAST. Starting fall of 2004, all OMB motor vehicle reporting will be accomplished through FAST. This change was mandated to endure that all agency reports of motor vehicle data contain identical data.

FY2003 FEDERAL FLEET REPORT

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

PURPOSE:

This annual report is designed to provide essential statistical data for worldwide Federal motor vehicle fleet operations. Review of the report assists Government agencies in evaluating the effectiveness of the operation and management of their individual fleets in order to determine whether vehicles are being utilized properly and to identify those high cost areas where fleet expenses can be reduced. The report is also used by various segments of private industry in addition to State and local governments.

BACKGROUND:

This report summarizes statistical data on agency-owned, GSA Fleet and commercially-leased vehicles. The data also details each agency's fleet categorizing their vehicles by civilian, military, postal service and domestic, foreign, and worldwide. This report includes sedans, station wagons, ambulances, buses, and trucks. Additional detail is provided for sedan class and truck subtypes (4x2, 4x4, medium and heavy truck). Charts and graphs present the trend and detailed table data. No data is available for privately-owned vehicles.

The accuracy of data contained in this report improves each year as more and more Federal agencies upgrade their fleet automated systems. Additionally for this year, agencies started reporting data for the Office of Management and Budget on motor vehicles that may not have been included in previous year's reports. Accordingly, the reported size of the Federal motor vehicle fleet increased by 3.5-percent during fiscal year 2003, which may not reflect an increase in the actual number of vehicles in use by Federal agencies. Similar occurrences may appear in other categories, such as cost or miles traveled. Of continued concern is accurate reporting of alternative fuel consumption because of differences in the coding of these fuels by the fuel providers and credit card merchants. Because of these differences, agencies are not able to accurately report alternative fuel use.

SUMMARY OF DATA:

- Federally operated vehicles totaled 599,851, an increase of 3.51 percent from FY 2002 (Chart 2).
- There were 22 large fleets (over 2,000 vehicles) (Table 16).
- 36 percent of the Federal fleet is used by the Postal Service, 35 percent by civilian agencies, and 29 percent by the military (Chart 1B).
- 69 percent of the Federal fleet is owned by the using agencies, 29 percent is leased from GSA Fleet, and 2 percent is leased commercially (Chart 1C).
- Mileage decreased 4.81 percent, from 5.08 billion to 4.84 billion (Chart 6).
- Gallons of fuel consumed increased 5.05 percent, from 348.1 million to 365.7 million (Chart 8).
- Reported use of alternative fuels decreased 31.27 percent, from 8.828 million gallon-equivalents to 6.067 million (Chart 8).
- Total cost of operation increased 11.44 percent, from \$2.34 billion to \$2.61 billion (Chart 10).
- Domestic average cost per mile increased 19.03 percent, from \$0.4168 to \$0.4961 (Chart 12). Foreign cost per mile increased 33.51 percent, from \$0.4440 to \$0.5928.
- The number of commercially leased vehicles decreased 0.75 percent, from 11,800 to 11,711 (Chart 2).
- The total worldwide cost of commercial leasing increased 9.05 percent from \$64.0 million to \$69.8 million (Chart 10).

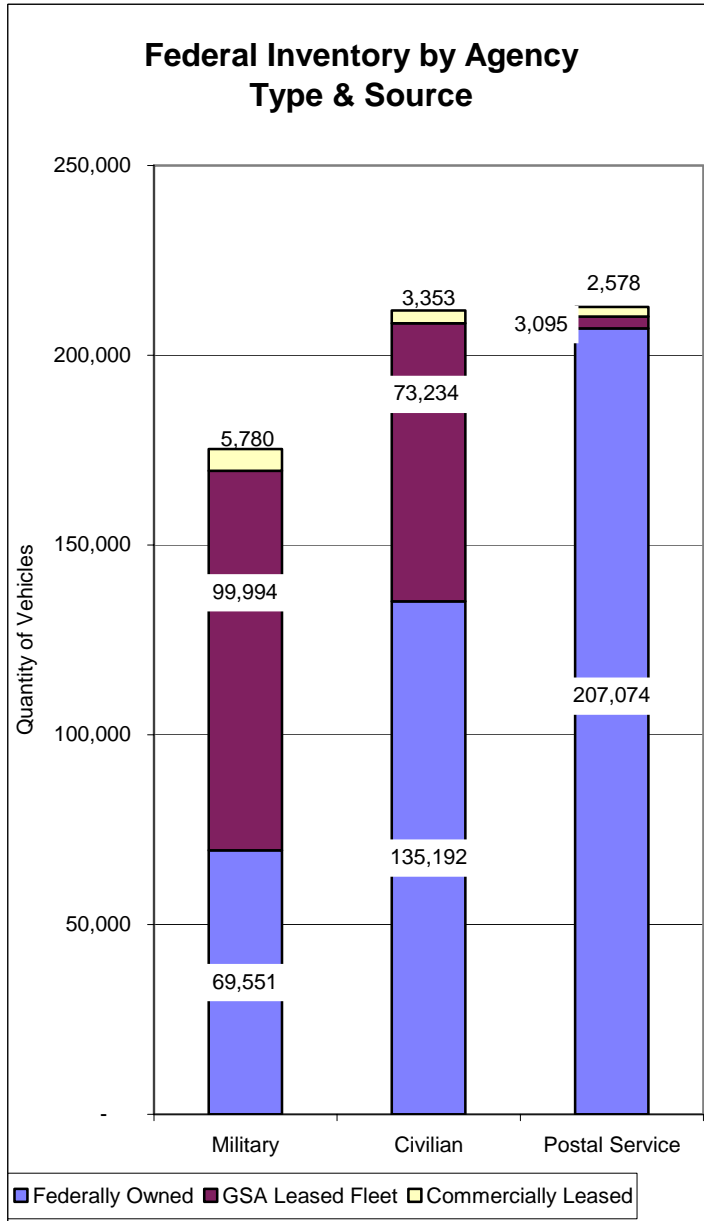

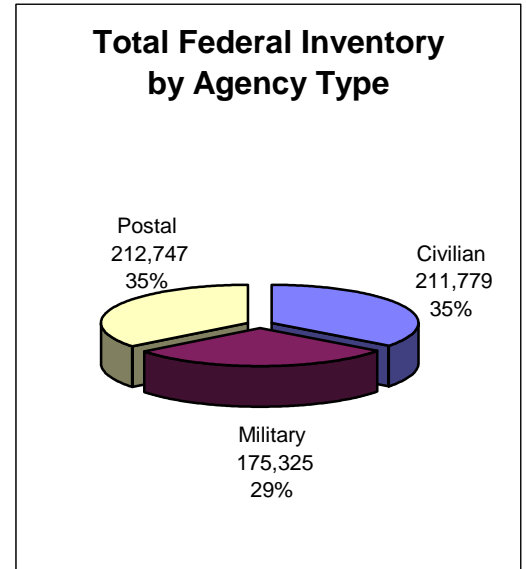
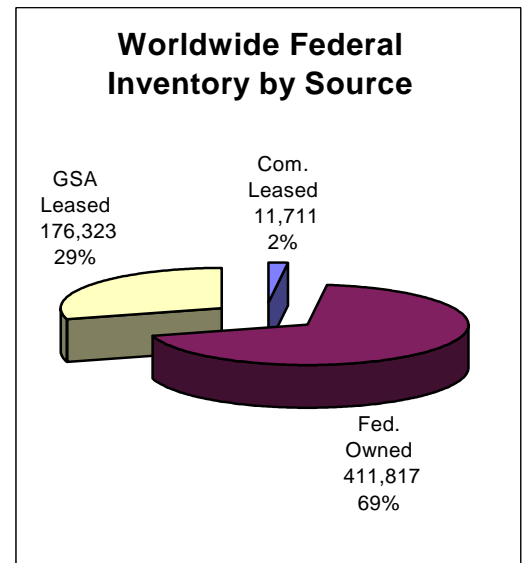

VEHICLE LEASING

GSA Fleet is part of GSA's Office of Vehicle Acquisition and Leasing Services, a component of the Federal Supply Service. GSA Fleet is a centralized source for obtaining fleet vehicles and management services for Federal agencies and authorized contractors. GSA Fleet provides nearly every sort of non-tactical vehicle, from sedans to heavy equipment, including alternative fuel vehicles, at monthly and per-mile rates that cover all elements of cost, including fuel and maintenance. GSA Fleet is a non-mandatory source of supply, and therefore aims to provide vehicles and services at the lowest possible cost and the greatest possible convenience. GSA Fleet services are provided through a network of Regional Fleet Management offices, local Fleet Management Centers, and a centralized Maintenance Control Center.

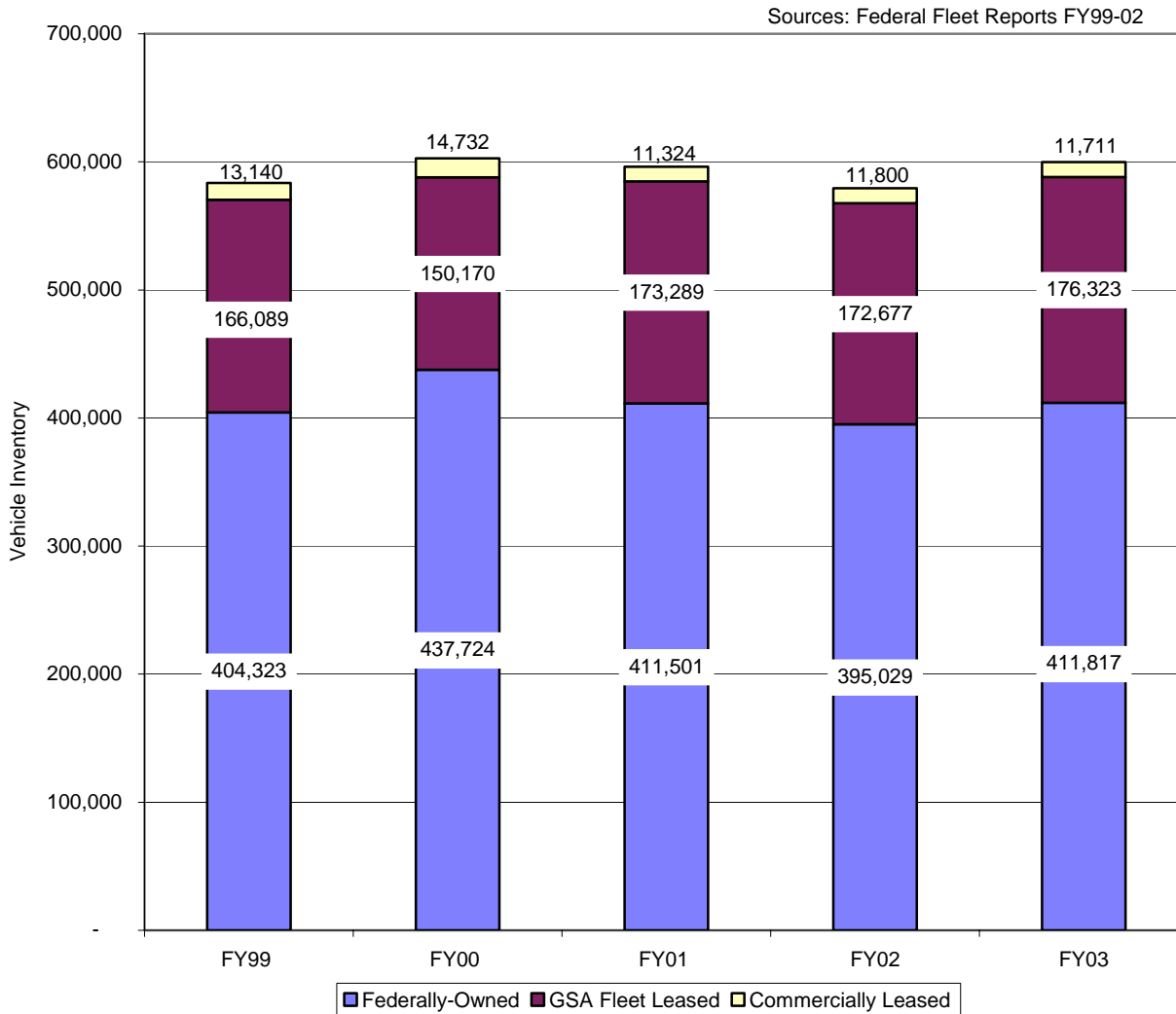

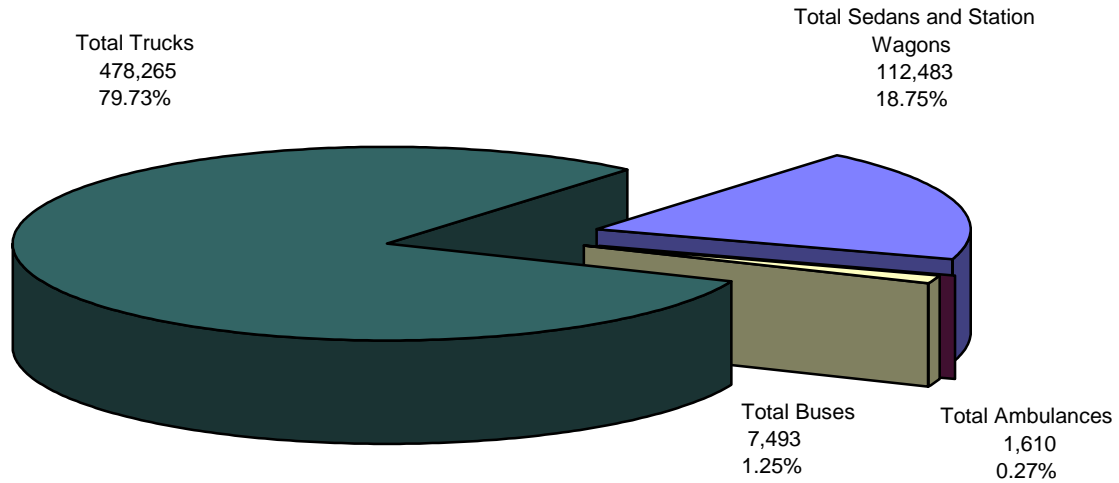
Chart 2: Worldwide Inventory Changes Since 1999

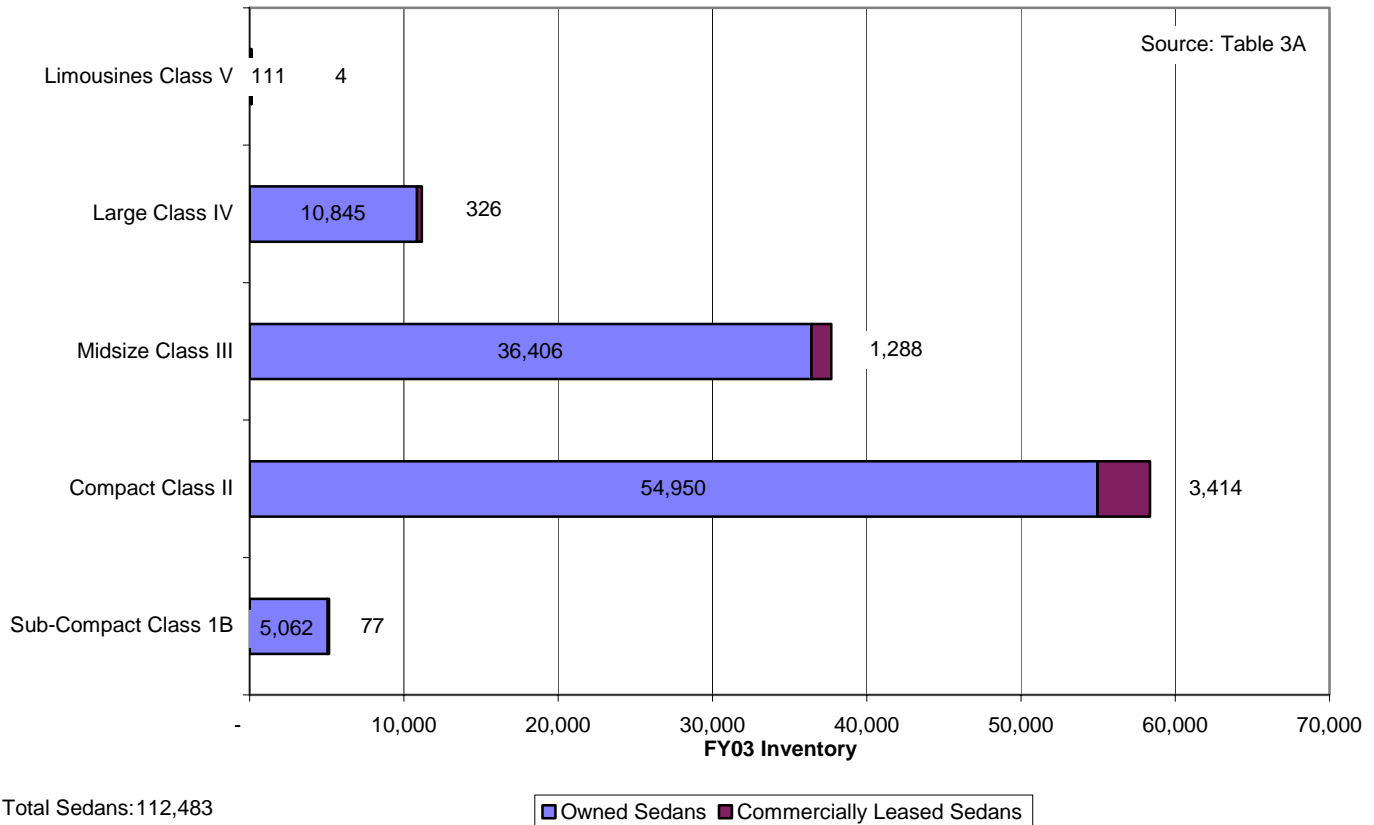

Chart 4: Worldwide Inventory of Federally Owned and Commercially Leased Sedans by Size Classification

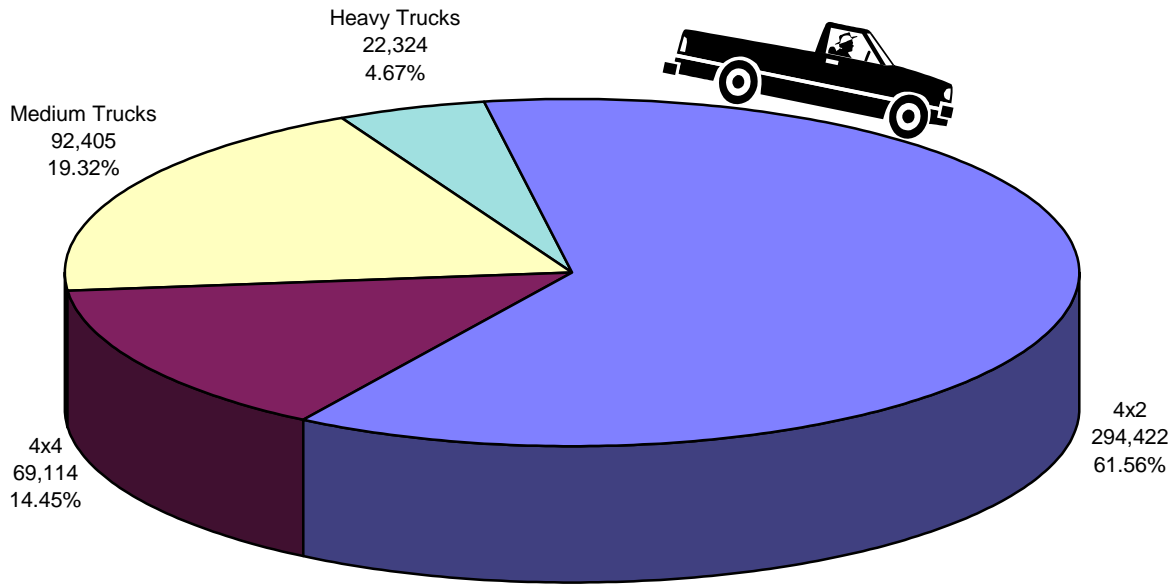

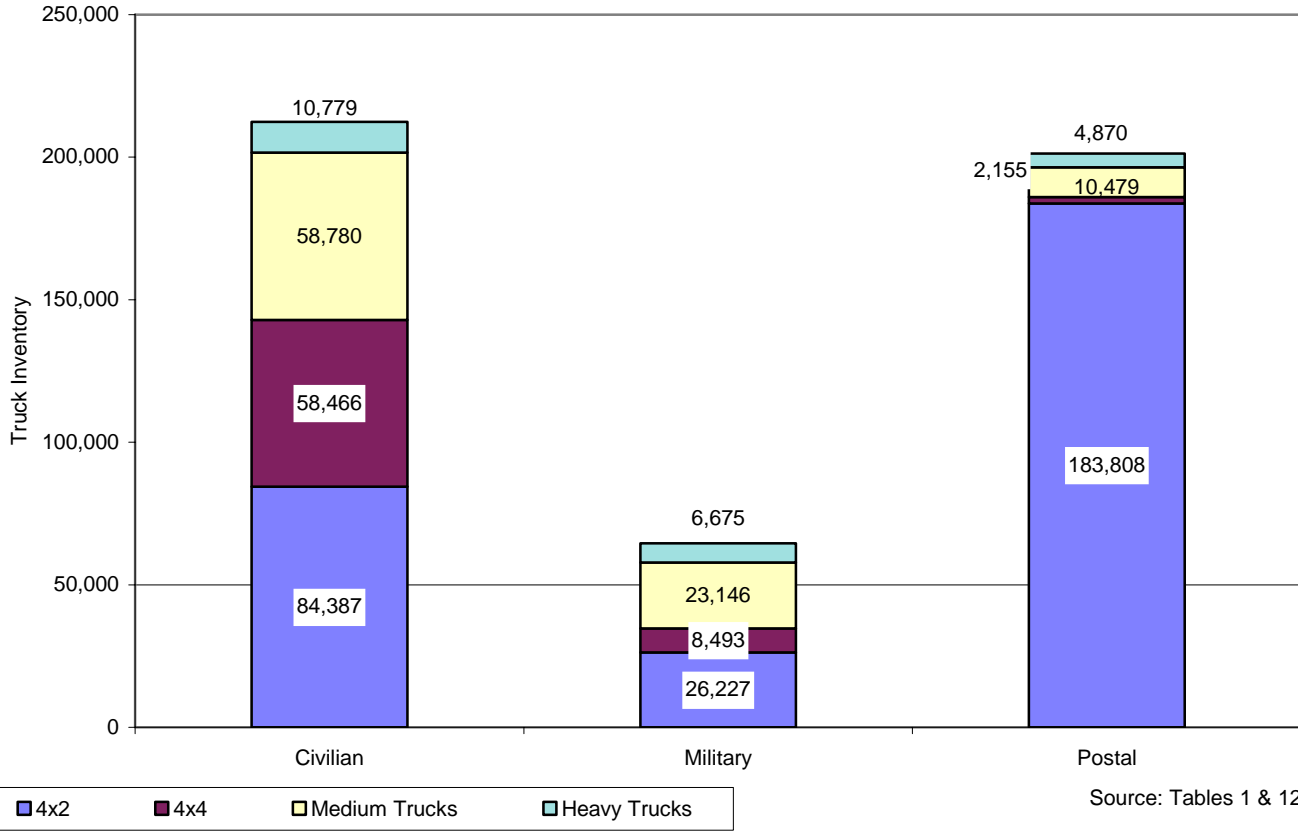

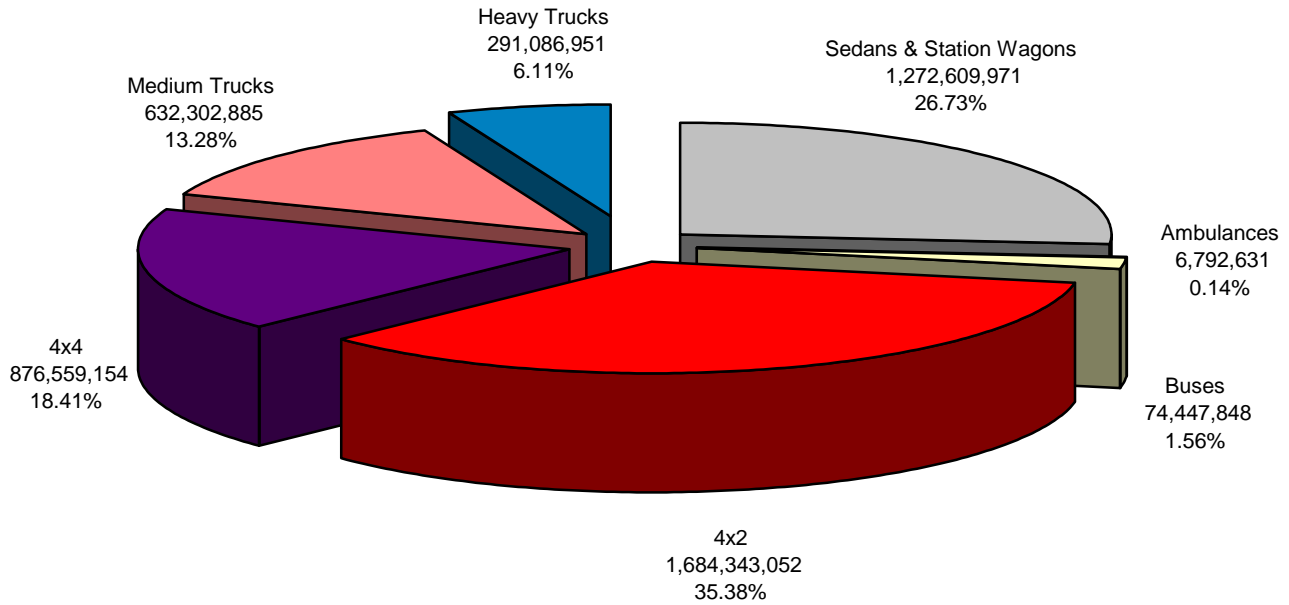

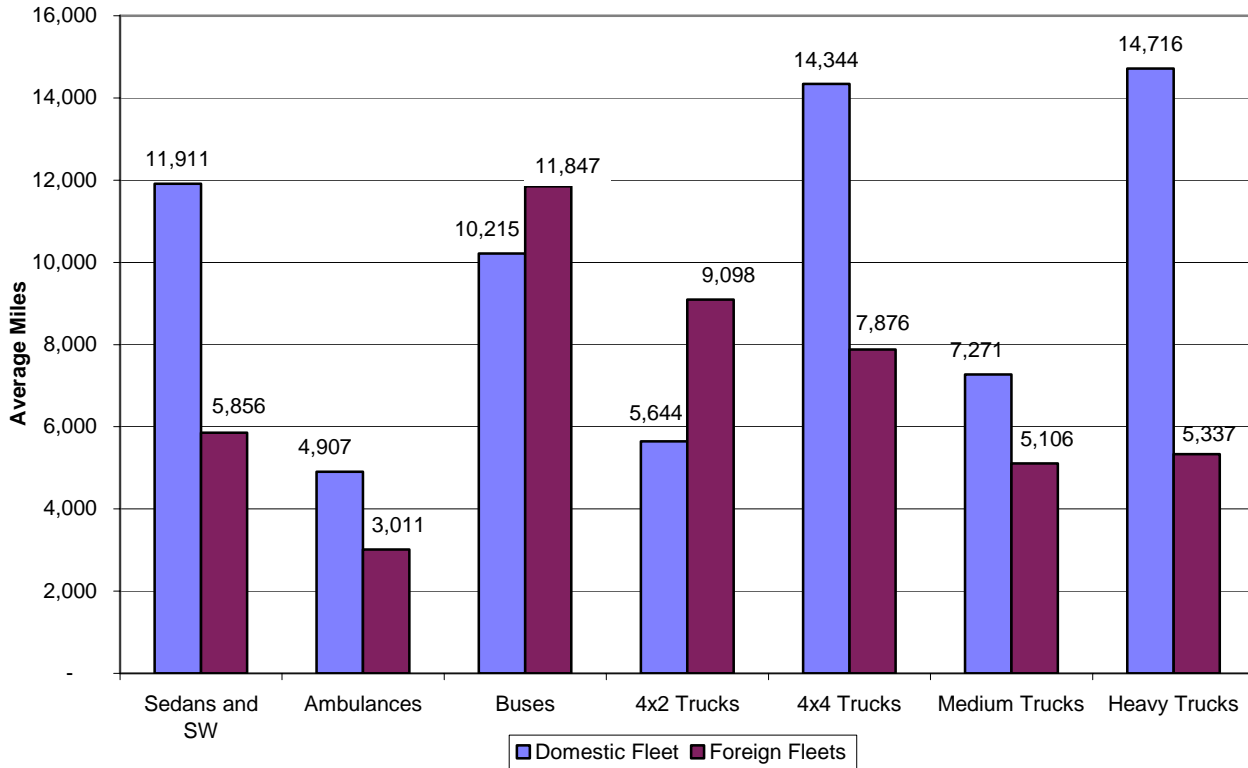

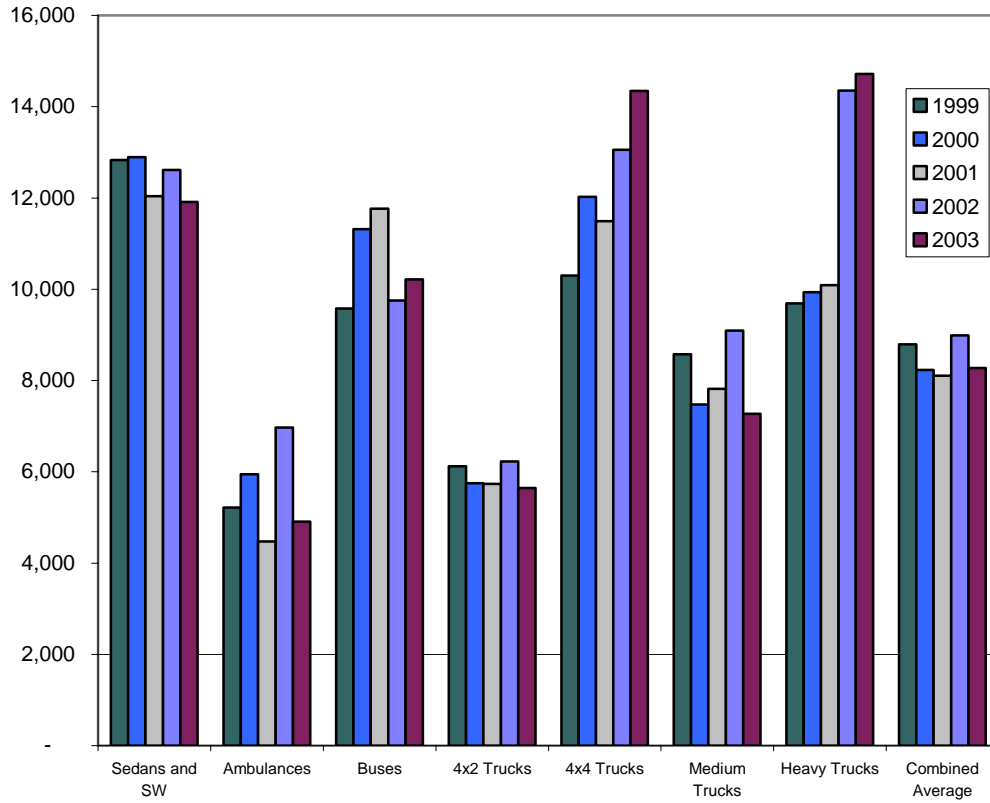
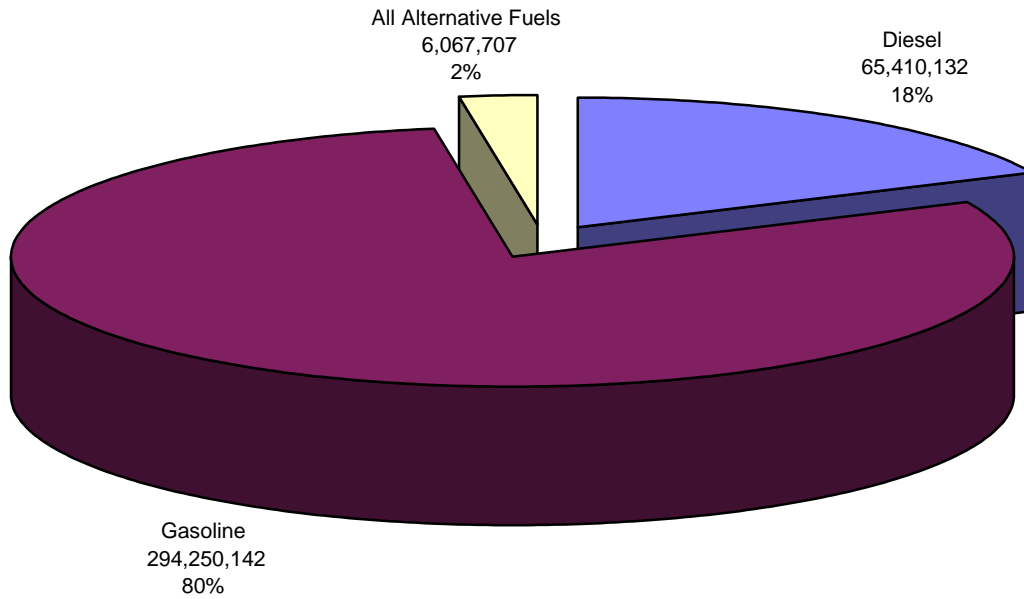


Chart 8: Fuel Consumed by Fuel Type Gallon Equivalent

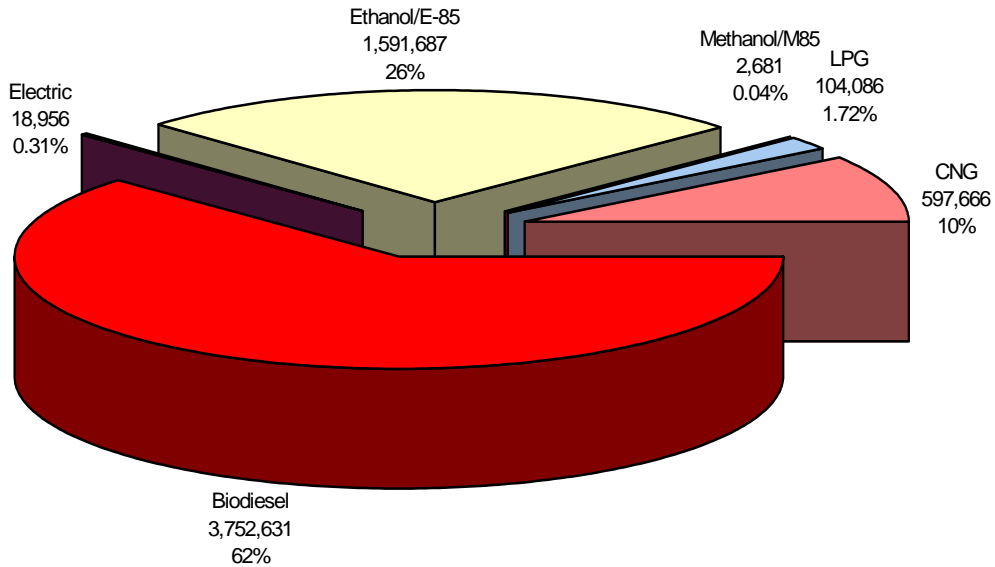

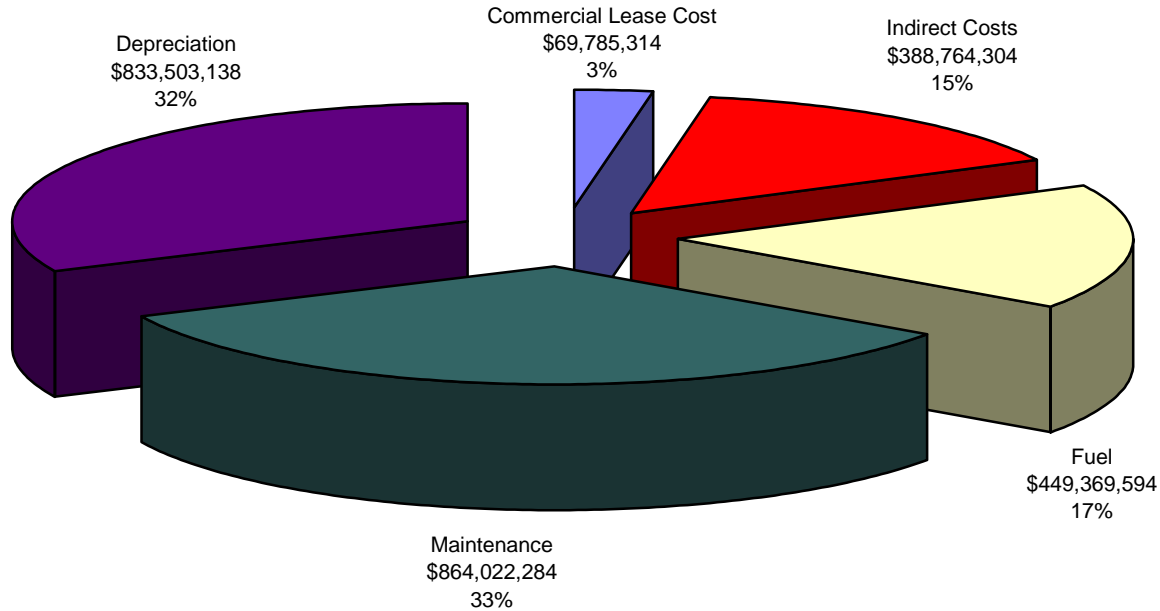

Chart 10: Agency Owned & Commercially Leased Worldwide Operating Cost Data by Cost Type



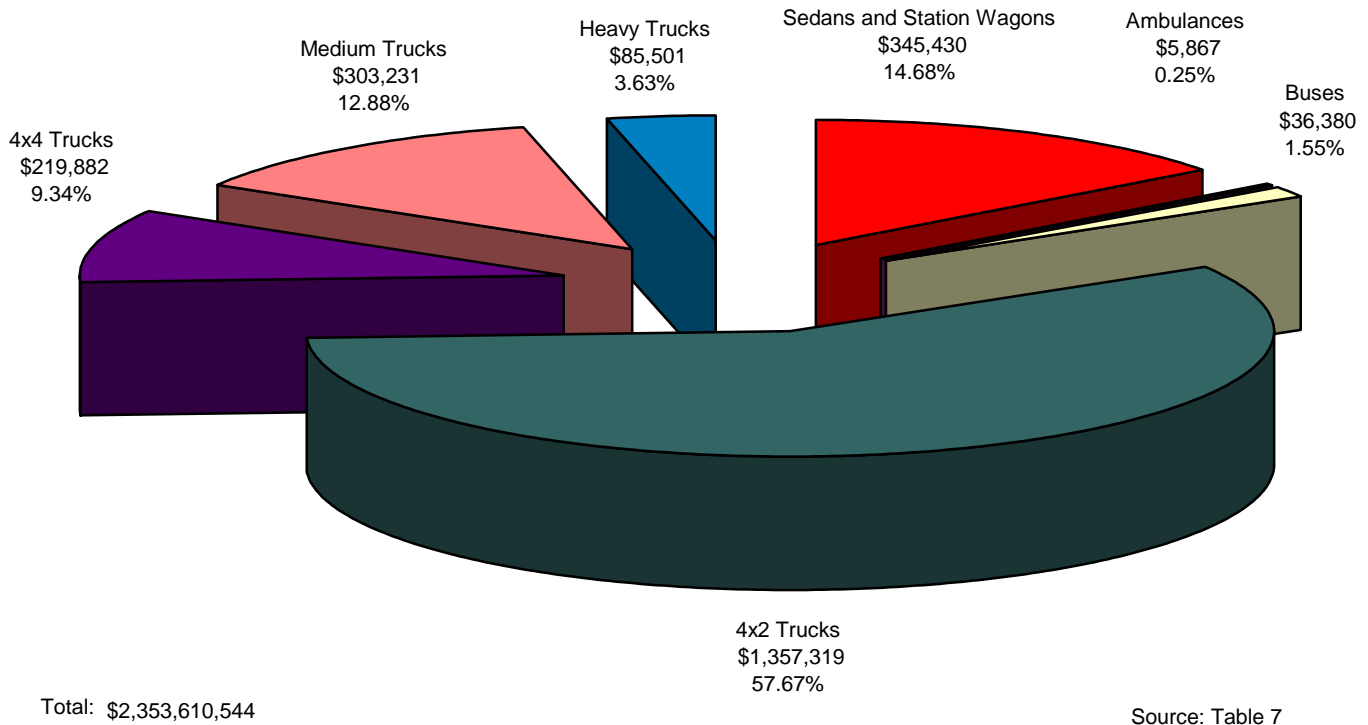

Chart 11: Agency Owned Worldwide Operating Cost Data by Vehicle Type Including Depreciation

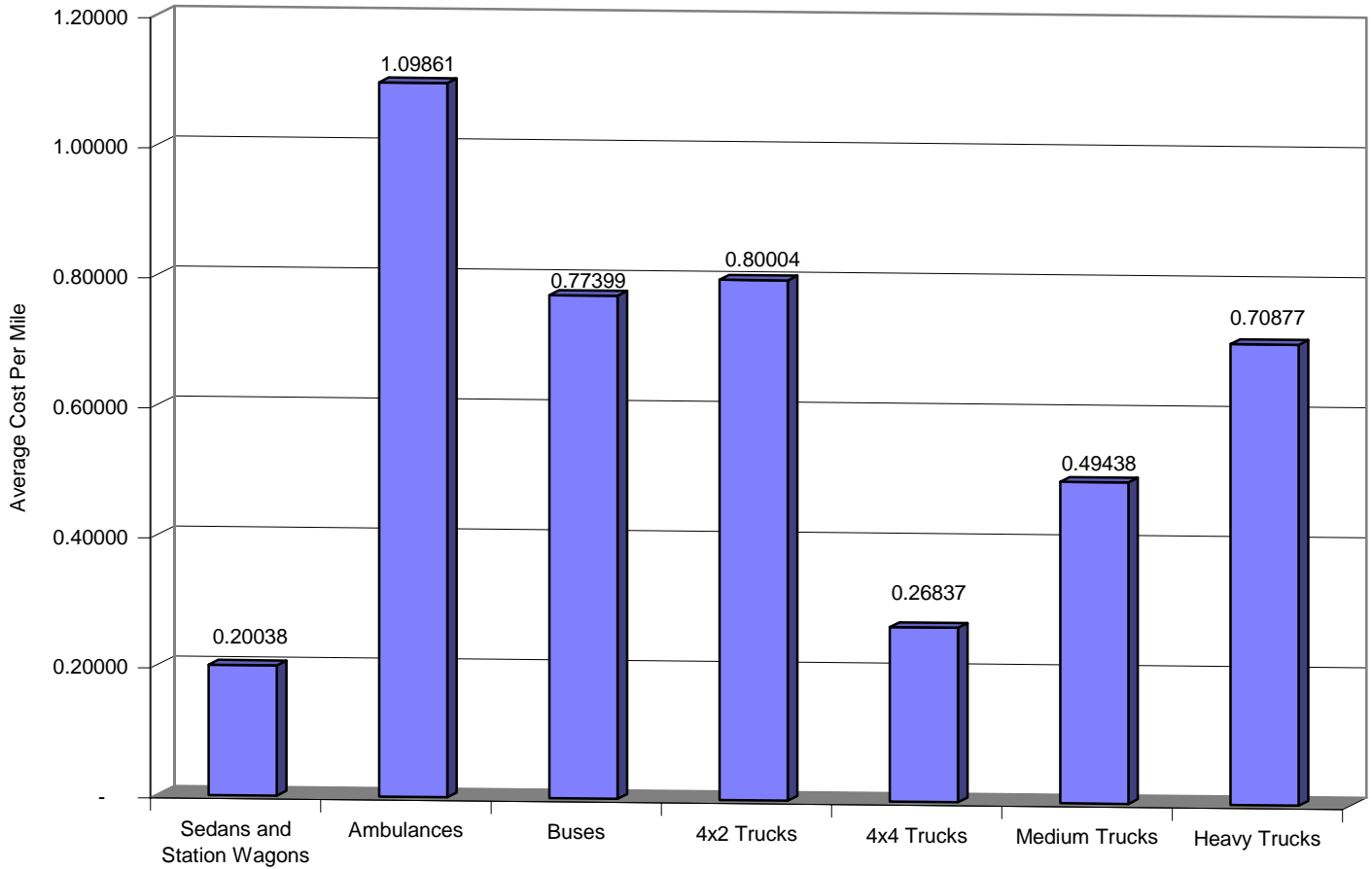

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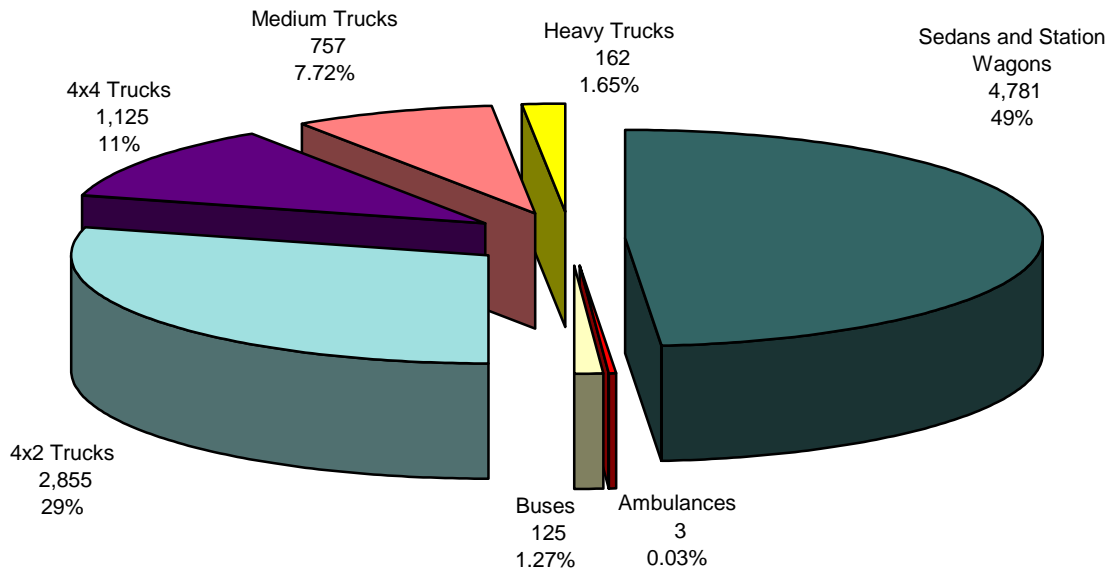

Chart 13: Commercially Leased Vehicles: Average Number on Hand - All Agencies (Domestic)



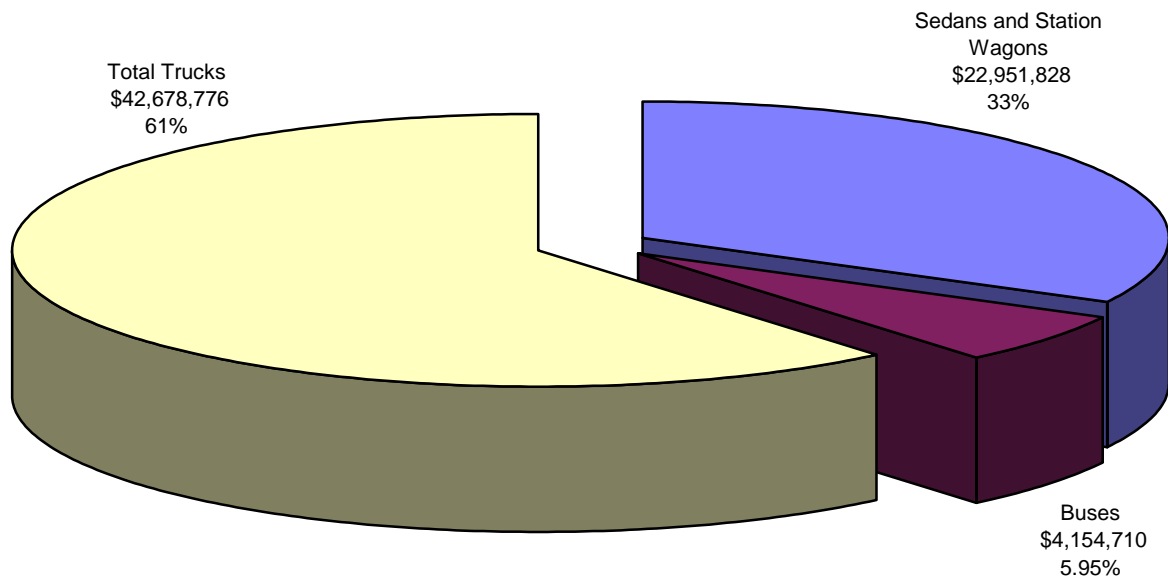

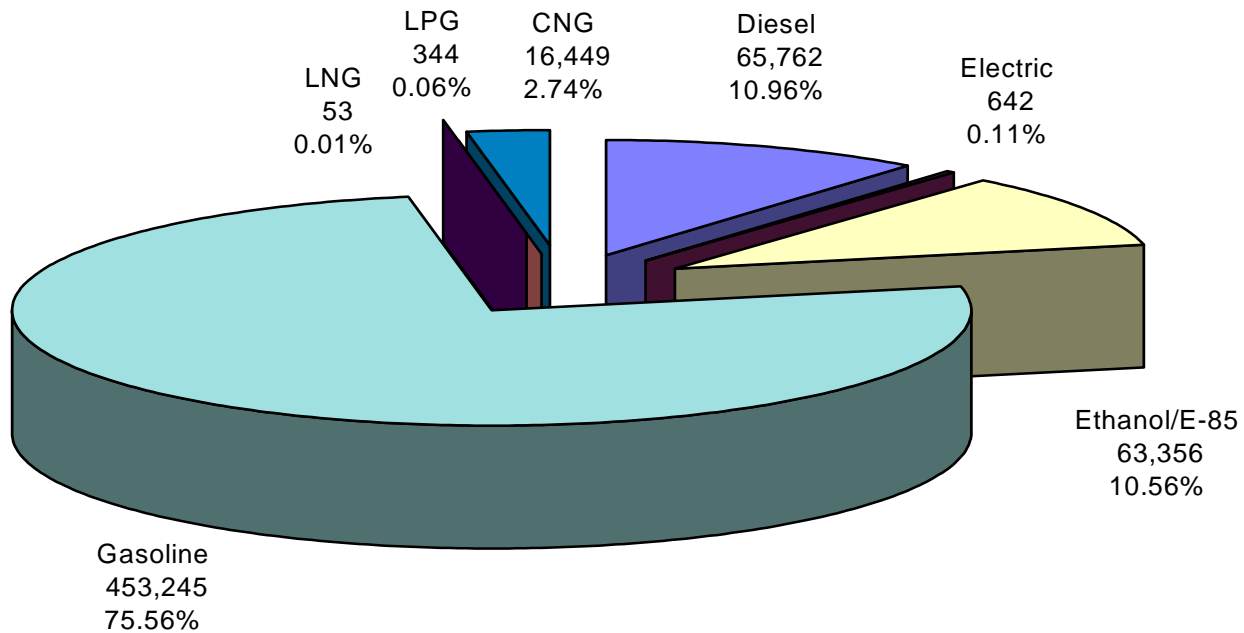

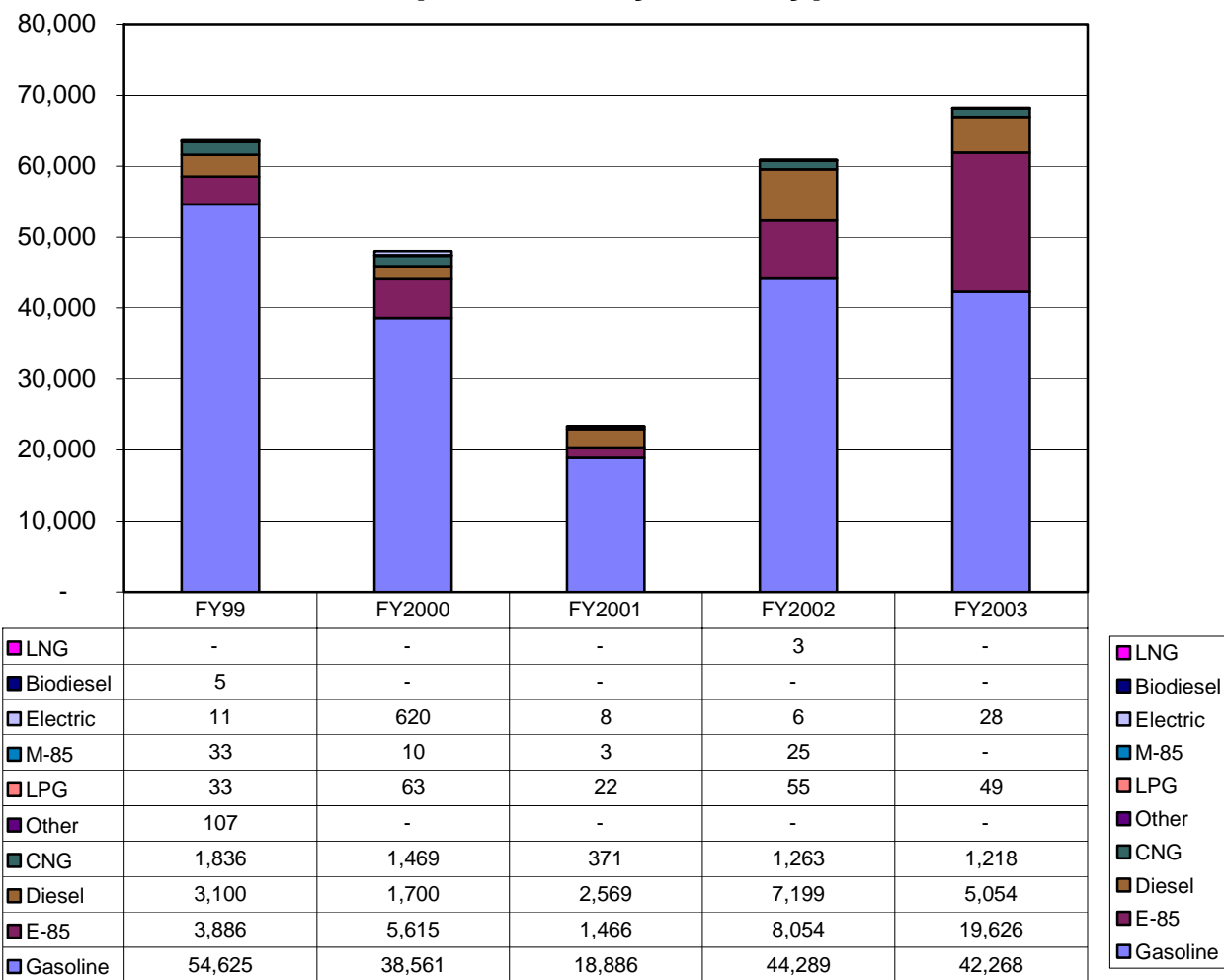

GLOSSARY

ACQUISITION— An addition to an agency's inventory. The source of the addition can be purchase of a new (or used) vehicle, acquiring a vehicle through a commercial lease, or from GSA Fleet. Replacements for vehicles retired and sold count as acquisitions. Vehicles transferred from one activity to another within an agency do not constitute acquisitions. Acquisitions should be reported in the year they are ordered, even though physical receipt may not have occurred until the following reporting period.

ACQUISITION COST—The initial purchase price of a vehicle, including all costs incidental to placing it in service, such as shipping and factory prep.

ASSIGNMENT—Another term for lease from GSA Fleet. Assignment can occur whenever one accountable organizational element makes its vehicle(s) available for use by another.

COMMERCIAL LEASE—Acquisition of a vehicle for 60 days or more from a commercial source. Acquisition of vehicles from commercial sources for less than 60 days is considered short-term rental, and not reported.

DEPRECIATION— A major component of vehicle cost; generally, the difference between acquisition cost and anticipated sales proceeds. For purposes of this report, GSA Fleet reports its depreciation cost expressed as a cost-per-mile, which is then applied to other agencies' reported mileage (except Postal Service, which supplies its own depreciation cost). Agencies on appropriated funds typically do not recognize depreciation expense or account for it in their internal accounting systems.

DIRECT COST—Operating expenses attributable to an individual vehicle or class of vehicles, such as maintenance and depreciation.

DISPOSAL—Removal of a vehicle from inventory, usually by sale, but also through transfers and donations. For activities on revolving funds, proceeds from disposal are available for the purchase of replacement vehicles. For agencies on appropriations, disposal proceeds usually do not return to the fleet activity.

DOMESTIC—Referring to any State, Commonwealth, territory, or possession of the United States.

FOREIGN—Outside any State, Commonwealth, territory, or possession of the United States.

GSA FLEET LEASE—A vehicle acquired by a Federal agency or authorized contractor from GSA Fleet. Such vehicles are usually Government owned, but are treated similarly to commercial leased vehicles by using agencies.

INDIRECT COST—Expenses that cannot be readily attributed to an individual vehicle or class of vehicles because they are incurred in connection with overall fleet operation: office supplies, printing, utilities, and other general management and overhead.

LARGE FLEET—2,000 or more reportable vehicles, domestic or foreign, for which accountability is held by a Federal agency's organizational element or by a contractor. Large fleets are required to report on inventory, commercial leasing, cost, mileage, and fuel used.

OWNING AGENCY—Federal agency or organizational element having accountability for Government owned vehicles. Characterized by the authority to take possession of, assign, reassign, or sell a vehicle, regardless of which agency or element is using the vehicle.

PASSENGER VEHICLE—Sedans and station wagons. Although passenger vans and sport utilities are sometimes considered passenger vehicles, Federal Standards and this report classify them as light trucks.

REPORTABLE VEHICLE—All commercial-design, non-tactical vehicles, excluding special-purpose equipment. Includes vehicles acquired from all sources, including owned, GSA Fleet-leased, or commercially leased.

SMALL FLEET—Less than 2,000 reportable vehicles held by an organizational element of a Federal agency. Small fleets are required to report only vehicle inventory and commercial leasing information.

USING AGENCY—The Federal agency or organizational element with day-to-day use of a vehicle that it does not own. Agencies assigned vehicles by GSA Fleet are using agencies, GSA Fleet is the owning agency.

UTILIZATION—A measurement of a vehicle's rate of use, usually expressed in miles per vehicle per month or per year.

VEHICLE CLASS—A system of categorizing vehicles based on the Federal Standards.
