## Dubai F1 Car Racing Team May Cost \$1 Bln; Coulthard Could Lead

(Bloomberg.com) -- Dubai may spend as much as \$1 billion during the next seven years setting up the first independent Formula One motor-racing team since 1997, for which McLaren driver David Coulthard may race, Arabian Business reported.

The team, to be called Team Dubai F1, will start building a technical center and a wind tunnel for aerodynamic testing in the U.K. next year at a cost of more than \$100 million, the Dubai, United Arab Emirates monthly magazine reported in its December issue.

The team, which will be based in Dubai, will have a budget of about \$150 million a year and run its first race in the 2006 world championship, the magazine said, without saying where it got its information. Coulthard may be the lead driver for the team, which may use Mercedes-Benz AG engines, the magazine said.

Dubai, which is spending billions of dollars on infrastructure to triple the number of annual visitors to 15 million by the end of the decade, is facing increased competition from other Persian Gulf monarchies seeking to attract tourist events. Bahrain this year became the first Arab country to host a Formula One championship.

## Robby Gordon for Dakar VW (www.autpsport.com)

Versatile US racing star Robby Gordon has signed up to contest this year's Dakar Rally as part of a four-car challenge from Volkswagen with its Race-Touaregs.

Gordon joins three former Dakar winners in the strongest squad yet fielded by VW. The other cars will be driven by former World Rally Champion Juha Kankkunen – the 1998 Dakar winner; Jutta Kleinschmidt ( the 2001 winner) and Bruno Saby who took his victory in the event back in 1993.

#### Japan GT Series in U.S.

The All-Japan Grand Touring Car Championship (JGTC) will race for the first time in the Us in a special event December 17-18 at the California Speedway in Fontana, CA.

Then it was on to Show and Tell. Quite a bit on the tables this time, as you can see from the pictures. Among the highlights:



Tim Leicht: a built 1/8 Rosso Ferrari 641 F1 car, with aftermarket decals and reprinted markings. This is a huge metal body piece. (see his review this issue). Also a built up1/12 Ferrari P4 Spyder, from the Classic Models Museums kit. A nice job from a somewhat rough resin kit.

John Schaefer: the new Porsche Carrera GT kit from Tamiya also his current project, a 1972 Dodge Charger NASCAR that is combining an MPC body with most of the other parts from the Polar Lights kit.

George Pritzen: an in progress funny car, using a Revell Dodge funny car engine and frame under an AMT Mitsubishi Eclipse body. Ed Sexton: the new Revell AG Renault R23 F1 kit in 1/24.



Ken Zinnen: the new AMT 1969 Corvair kit. Also in 1/43, a Provence Moulage Paganini Zonda C12S roadster, just started, and a Tameo Ferrari 126C2 kit, an F1 car from 1982 (the one with the split rear wings as run at Long Beach US GP).



Dave Edgecomb: a LeMans Miniatures 1/24 resin kit of the Porsche 908 Spyder that finished 3<sup>rd</sup> at the 1970 LeMans 24 Hours. Also some Speedline deacls and a resin rear tail for the Tamiya Porsche 956-962 kits. Chuck Herrmann: a built up Polar Lights VW Love Bug (in rat rod style) also an almost finished Gunze Sangyo Ferrari 365 GT4 BB, an in progress Revell AG Tabrant lowrider. And an ESCI Paris-Dakar Mercedes 450 SLC kit.

# Rosso's *Big* F1 Ferrari Kit

I thought when I got this kit that it was the Holy Grail of Formula One kits. Well, at the time, I guess it was. This super scale metal body kit was the rage at the time, even though Ferrari was the big loser in F1 at the time. Maybe that is how Rosso, a struggling new company at the time, got a license to do this kit. It was probably good PR for Ferrari at the time. Unfortunately, this kit was the beginning and the end of the Rosso company. Many rumors surfaced as to their demise from being underfunded, or the plant burned down, and even Ferrari pulled the license. I myself don't know what the real reason was, but I was glad to have the kit. These kits now sell on Ebay for as much as \$1,000.00! However, I decided to build mine. Here is the goods on this extremely rare kit.

Open the box and you realize that this kit is HUGE! It's almost two feet long! The prepainted body is very smooth, free of mold seams, with a shiny Ferrari red finish. The tub is comprised of plastic parts, along with metal


suspension arms and uprights. Assembly is mostly with screws (provided in the box) but there were over eleven different sizes and types of screws, so the first thing I did was to get a small plastic divider box and organize all the fasteners by size to keep them easy to match up. The tub parts were all molded in black, and not very realistic, as most carbon fiber is different color, based on its strength. So, I custom mixed some Tamiya acrylic paints to color the different shades based on photos of the actual car. Between that and the foil heat shield material provided in the kit, the tub turned out quite realistic. I also turned the kit provided brake rotors, which by the way, turn inside the calipers, from the chrome finish to carbon fiber as well, with some careful painting. Again, thanks to some reference pictures, they turned out beautiful!!



Now for the BAD NEWS The kit provided graphics came in two variants. Some were vinyl stickers and some were reverse printed graphics, similar to Tamiya tire logos on their current race kits. Well, the vinyl stickers were too thick, and the other decals, let's just say were unacceptable to say the least. I went to apply the Goodyear logos on the front wing, and POOF! They turned to powder as soon as they got wet! So, maybe it's just a flook. Well I tried the white Marelli logos on the body and the same thing happened! Now what do I do? I have a ten year old kit, the company is out of business, I can't just pick up the phone and order another set of decals, project ruined! Luckily, I had gotten two sheets of decals in the box, so I decided to have some new ones made. I got on the net and found a company called Aeroloft designs in Arizona. Actually, I was referred to them by Archer fine transfers on the net. Archer does numerous military dry

transfer sheets and no longer does custom work. Anyway, 4 months later, Aeroloft sent me some new dry transfer graphics. Unfortunately, a lot of them were a little fuzzy. The resolution was poor at best, but, they sent me three sheets of graphics, so I picked out the best of the lot, burnished them to clear decal paper, and applied them. I call them ten footers, because if you get close, you can see the not so crisp printing. But, you have to work with what you get.

The tires were painted with stencils that I already had, making them look very realistic. Also, the tires were stuffed with foam rubber, as the weight of this kit would flatten them as soon as you put it on the table. The headers, with six individual pipes on each side, were a real pain in the A\_\_! But, after twenty tries, I got them to fit together. With some careful heat spotting from Tamiya acrylic clears, the turned out VERY realistic! You would think this car could fire up and drive away at this point. So, now that the body was decorated, I applied five coats of Tamiya clear, rubbed it out and voila! A stunning example of this Ferrari race car.



As it came together, I was quite pleased with the outcome. Look at the pictures and you will see what I mean. While not the easy build, it turned out great.
