## **New Look AERO for IndyCar**

For IndyCar series road course events this year we will see a new look on the cars. Honda and Chevy engine teams will have distinctive areo kits. Each new aerodynamics package builds on the Dallara "DW12" chassis that debuted back in 2012, giving fans something other than paint jobs to distinguish which car is which on the track.

The biggest difference between Honda's new look and the previous design is with the front wing. The two-tiered design has been replaced with a three-tiered one that looks like a monstrous shaving razor. Also there is more body paneling at the rear, giving it a boxier back end. You would have seen these new cars just about the time you are seeing this issue this at the season opening St Petersburg event on March 28

Each of these new designs has over 100 parts that teams can use to mix and match for the best results. Both manufacturers are holding back the designs of the aerodynamics packages for oval tracks, which make up about half of IndyCar's schedule including of course the Indianapolis 500.



## No German Grand Prix this year.



# Nicht!!!

There will be no Formula One race in Germany for the first time since 1960, with the Nurburgring track organizers citing financial reasons for being unable to organize the grand prix. Nurburgring was scheduled to host this year's race on July 19, after Hockenheim hosted it last season.

So the home country of the current dominant F1 team will not have a grand prix race this season. Along with the lack of a French GP for several years, this continues the shift from the traditional European home base of F1 to other developing nations, such as Asia and the Middle East. Germany has had a total of 53 Formula One drivers, including seven-time world champion Michael Schumacher and four-time champion Sebastian Vettel.

## **BMW Retro Colors at Sebring**



BMW of North America designed a special livery, which pays homage to the IMSA 3.0 CSL, for the two BMW Team RLL Z4 GTLM cars entered in the 2015 edition of the 12 Hours of Sebring. In 1975 the 3.0 CSL won the race overall with drivers Brian Redman, Allan Moffat, Sam Posey and Hans Stuck.



This year the #25 car did not do so well, losing 10 laps to subframe repairs while finishing 22<sup>nd</sup> overall, 8<sup>th</sup> in the GTLM class with drivers Bill Auberlin, Dirk Werner and Agusto Farfus. But Auberlin did set the fastest lap in class.



Speaking of milestones, the winning Corvette Daytona Prototype was the first overall Sebring win for Chevy in 50 years, since Jim Halls Chaparral!

The Real Thing

This is a good looking car but I was foggy on the actual history of the car. After some Facebook followers advised some details and follow up on the internet, it is the Ford P68, also commonly known as the Ford 3L GT or F3L. It is a sports prototype racer model introduced in March 1968 to comply with the reduced engine size (3 liters for Group 6 prototypes) that ended the LeMans winning Ford Mk IV Program. Ford America withdrew from LeMans competition but Alan Mann Racing designed this car around the Ford DFV V8 Formula One engine. It was not very successful, changing rules at times made drivers such as Jack Brabham decide it was not safe to drive! Other drivers involved were Bruce McLaren, Denny Hulme, Jochen Rindt, Mike Spence, Masten Gregory, Pedro Rodriguez and Frank Gardner, who did most of the testing and ran it the most. It did have some competitive qualifying runs, including a pole position at Spa in 1969. But it never finished any of the eight races it started and the program ended mid 1969.

Again, too bad it is not 1/24.....



Ironically the "old" 5 liter Ford GT40 went on to huge wins at LeMans in 1968 and 1969 in the iconic orange and blue Gulf colors.

### **EVENTS**



Then it was on to Show & Tell. Here are some pictures of stuff on display.


**Dave Green** brought in a built up prepainted Revell Mustang kit,

Paul Heber brought this race car hauler with both a Camaro




and a Dodge short track stocker,

# Revell 2013 Dodge Challenger Predecorated Kit



**Description:** 2013 Dodge Challenger SRT8

Mfg: Revell Kit: 85-4358 Scale: 1/25

Body molded in purple plastic painted in Plum Crazy Purple metallic paint; other parts molded in dark metallic grey, clear and red; also included are chrome-plated wheels and headlight bezels and vinyl tires. There are no supplied decals, body decorations are tampoed on.

#### **Brief History of the marque:**

The first generation Challenger bowed its head in 1969 and was a stable mate to the Plymouth Barracuda, the original Chrysler "pony car" to play in that segment started by Ford's Mustang. The second generation "Challenger" from 1978 to 1983 was a badge engineered Mitsubishi Galant Lambda. The current generation of Challengers was introduced in early 2008 again to do battle with the fifth generation Mustang and Camaro segments that were exploding in popularity.



### The Kit:

As indicated above, the subject kit's body is very nicely painted in Dodge's modern rendition of Plum Crazy metallic paint complimented with dual white painted racing stripes, a favorite color and look of it's early 70's hayday. This kit is also available in "Hemi-Orange" prepainted body as well. My samples' purple paint job was

practically flawless; the white stripes were righton and again flawless. There is a separate 8 piece 6.4 litre engine that makes up into a very nice replica of the famous Hemi engine, too bad the engine bay hides most of it. The underside of the unibody chassis includes a separate and nicely molded exhaust system and front crossmember. The balance of the kit including the chassis and interior components are crisply molded in a metallic dark grey plastic.

This kit marks a new genre of assembly kits for Revell and its' large audience of automotive modelers. The Challenger and Camaro prepainted kits are targeted as a 'bridge' models for the modeler who want to graduate from the snaptite models into full multi part unpainted main-line glue kits. Actually this kit and its siblings are for car modelers of all ages including adults that want to build nicely decorated car kits that they can't or don't want to paint for whatever reason. Believe me; this kit makes a very nice display model that anyone can be proud of.

#### The Build:

The instruction sheet is well done and is composed of 11 subassemblies starting with the engine and ending with attaching the mirrors.



This last step I think is where there may be difficulties for the young and newbie builders. The mirrors attach to the body by gluing the mirror onto a molded pad on the door; there are no mechanical tabs and slots for both mirrors that you might find on other kits. Proper adhesion of the mirrors involves carefully scraping the paint off both of the door pad and the bottom of the mirror for adequate adhesion. I used Faller liquid glue applied with its needle tip. That folks is the trickiest assembly part of this kit.



I started my build pretty much by the included directions; assembling most of the engine components as well as detaching the exhaust system from the sprue and then shootingh those with Testors 1451 Aluminum plate. Next the interior was assembled as sub assemblies and painted with Tamya TS-42 Light Gun Metal spray. The instrument faces on the dash were later painted white. Finally I didn't care for the chrome Conestoga wheel look so a quick dip in Castrol Super Clean removed (make sure you wear eye and hand protection) the plating. Then a quick spritz with Tamiya TS-38 Gun Metal made the wheels look more presentable to me; just a personal comment here folks. The only other modification I made to make the kit more realistic was to paint the engine bay part of the engine bay/interior module Plum Crazy as it is on the 1:1 car although the instructions call out black paint.



#### **Conclusion:**

I think that Revell has successfully tapped into a new market with the Challenger and the Camaro that will appeal specifically to both ends of the modeler skill level spectrum. I run into people all of the time that don't want to make a traditional paint and glue model but still want to do a more detailed kits compared to a snap fit kit because they are not ready for the body painting/decalling end of the build. This kit makes a nice shelf model you can point to and proudly say "I made that". I reside on the assemble and paint end of the spectrum with an occasional snapper, however I thoroughly enjoyed building and detail painting this attractive model; my friends at the model car club could not get over the how nice it turned out, especially the paint and tampoing. I had a blast building this model and it was a refreshing alternative to my normal builds. Thanks to Revell for supplying this review kit and IPMS/USA for allowing me to review it for you.

## Krylon Brown Boots Paint for leather interiors

Several members have asked what I have been using on some recent builds for the look of brown leather for seats and interiors. I have tried many shades of brown over the years. In one of the model magazines I read that someone used Krylon aerosol available at craft stores like Hobby Lobby and Michaels. So while my wife and I were at Hobby Lobby for her craft shopping I picked up several shades. I think that this Brown Boots, in a satin finish, looks okay.



Here are the seats I used on the MPC Jeep shown last meeting. To pick out the highlights I use a wash of The Last Detail, black in the recesses. It also adds a touch of sheen that resembles leather or vinyl. This looks okay but I will still keep trying other paints as there are many variants of real leather used in automotive interiors.
