Driving in Style: Promo Cars of the 1950s and 60s

February 7 – May 3, 2015

I was there on the last day of the display so I stopped in to see this exhibit of about 40 old late 50's-early 60s promo models, along with some automotive books on display.



The exhibit description was:

The innovative and flamboyant car designs of the 1950s are now iconic. To whet consumers' appetites for the "latest thing," the Big Three American automakers (General Motors, Ford and Chrysler) began to release new models with slightly redesigned features every year. To promote the new vehicles, dealers distributed highly-detailed plastic models or "promos." Like their full-size versions, these colorful miniatures boasted streamlined tail fins and polished chrome grilles, reflections of the period's Space Age design and general prosperity. Given to potential buyers and their children, these salesman's samples are highly collectible today. Lent by Robert Reinhold and John O'Halloran, the promos in EAM's presentation will be on view in the McCormick House, also designed in the 1950s.

While not the biggest display, I always think it is a positive thing when any aspect of our hobby is showcased in such a formal setting. It gives it a sort of legitimacy as a piece of culture, not just some toys collected by adults who never really grew up.



Also a Renault R5 police car kit from ESCI.




Chuck Herrmann had the latest progress on the Dodge Monaco Joker Goon Car project build,

a Revell Sunoco Ron Fellow Trans Am Camaro. Except it was for the 2014 Pony Car theme! I guess better late than never.


Dave Edgecomb had some kits, including the new Tamiya Mercedes Benz Gull Wing,

Denise McCluggage

1927-2015



Automotive journalist, racing driver, author, and pioneer, Denise McCluggage passed away May 6.



McCluggage raced in the 1950s and 60s. She won class victories at Sebring and Rally Monte Carlo, and finished fifth at the Watkins Glen Grand Prix of 1960. She also won many women-only races.




Honors include induction into the Automotive Hall of Fame and the SCCA Hall of Fame, a Ken Purdy Award for Excellence in Automotive Journalism, and the Dean Batchelor Lifetime Achievement Award. She also hung out with Miles Davis and Dave Brubeck and appeared on TV game show "To tell the Truth". She raced with Fangio, Moss, and Hill. Her weekly syndicated column called "Drive, She Said" appeared in some 90 newspapers across the U.S. and Canada. She was the author or contributor of a number of books.



Her trademark was a white helmet with black dots. Her racing achievements included winning the GT category at Sebring in a Ferrari 250 GT in 1961, and she scored a class win in the Monte Carlo Rally in a Ford Falcon in 1964. She also participated in the 1000-km race at the Nürburgring. She drove Porsches, Maseratis and other racing cars of many marques, often with her compatriot Pinkie Rollo. She ended her racing career in the late 1960s and eventually became founding editor of the U.S. automotive magazine *AutoWeek*, where she remained a Senior Contributing Editor until her death.



She was usually in the thick of the action back in the day.

Kit Review: Revell's VW Rabbit



Description: 1974 Volkswagen Rabbit
Mfg: Revell **Kit:**85-4333 **Scale:** 1/24

Subject: The **Volkswagen Golf** was introduced as the next generation replacement for the iconic VW Beetle in 1974. It was a front-wheel drive, front-engine replacement for the air-cooled, rear-engine, rear-wheel drive Beetle, which was phased out due to energy and environmental concerns of the early 70's. Historically, the Golf is Volkswagen's best-selling model and the world's second best-selling model, with more than 29 million built by 2012. The first version is also known as the Mk 1, and it was marketed in the US as the VW Rabbit, (and in Mexico as the Caribe). That is the subject of this all new tooling kit from Revell in 1/24 scale. It was first developed by Revell Germany, released in Europe in Golf and Golf Convertible variants, and now it is repacked for the US market as the Rabbit.

Kit: Revell had not done the Mk1 version; there were later versions by Revell and other kit manufacturers. AMT did a kit of the first generation Golf/Rabbit (and also the Sirocco) but it was a not good kit, especially the chassis and suspension. So this new version was overdue in the market.



The kit comes in the usual current packaging from Revell US, parts are molded in white, chrome and clear with vinyl tires. It is a full detail kit, unlike many of the Japanese kits of the early

Golfs. It can only be built as a street stock version.


Body: The body is one piece with a separate hood. The front and rear fascias are separate, bumpers are not chrome so they would need to be painted aluminum. Windows are separate pieces which attach from the outside. There are separate wipers and door handles

Engine: The kit features a detailed four cylinder engine which assembles into an engine compartment assembly with the inner wheel wells, a bit different design.


Chassis: One main piece, the before mentioned engine/wheel well tub assembly attaches to the front. The front springs and spindles allow for poseable front wheels.



The kit features the steel wheels, there are chrome dog dish wheel covers.



Interior: The interior builds up into a tub style with separate side panels. There are two dashboards to allow for either right or left hand drive. Gauges are decals. Front seats are two piece stock buckets, and the rear seat is a separate, helpful for racing versions. There is a separate roof liner.



The decal sheet contains body stripes, engine compartment markings, four sets of license plates. and various nationality bumper stickers.

Summary: This looks like a nice kit, much more detailed than the earlier AMT Mk1 Golf/Rabbit. I do not have the Revell Germany kits but I was able to download the instruction seat from the Revell company website for the European spec kit. There are differences for this Rabbit kit, the left and right hand drive interiors, also different shift consoles and shifters. There are separate clear plastic pieces for the side marker lights for the US version. And the dog dish wheel covers are also US version.

VW's Golf Mk1 Crosses the Americas

Forty years ago the new Golf 1 was subjected to its longest endurance test. A team drove more than 9,500 miles down North and South America, from Alaska to Tierra del Fuego, Chile in a car that had just gone into series production.

Wood Finishes

At the May GTR meeting Steve Jahnke brought in several woody wagons he is working on. So


naturally he was asked how he achieves the glossy wood finish on his cars.




Once the body colors are applied, the wood areas are brush painted with various shades of brown.



Then the brown paint is covered by acrylic clear Orange paint. This allows the brown paint to show through with what appears to be a coat of varnish.



This also is useful for other detail areas. I have used it to replicate wood steering wheels and shifter knobs in interiors. A thinned black wash also helps show the "grain" if it is molded in.



Either Tamiya or Gunze acrylics work fine.
