[Amending the Deposition Cross-Noticing Requirements in Order No. 36]

Order No. 25 (14-MD-2543 Docket No. 422) sets out the Court’s bellwether trial plan for cases in MDL 2543 involving personal injury and wrongful death claims based on alleged defects in vehicles manufactured by New GM or General Motors Corporation (“Old GM”). (*Id.* ¶ 5).

Pursuant to the parties’ agreement, it is hereby ORDERED that case-specific bellwether depositions (*i.e.*, depositions of case-specific expert witnesses or witnesses designated pursuant to Order No. 43 (Docket No. 744) as Category 3, Category 4, Category 5, and Category 6 fact witnesses) do not need to be cross-noticed in the Coordinated Actions. Accordingly, the first two sentences of Paragraph 20 of the Amended Deposition Protocol Order (Order No. 36, Docket No. 604) are amended to state as follows:

All Common Witness depositions in this MDL Proceeding shall be cross-noticed in the Coordinated Actions. All Common Witness depositions in a Coordinated Action shall be cross-noticed in this MDL Proceeding and in the other Coordinated Actions.
