INDICTMENT

The Grand Jury charges:

Count 1

On or about April 10, 2022, in San Juan County, in the District of New Mexico, the defendant, **MYLES CORDELLE DAN PADILLA**, with the intent to cause death and serious bodily harm, took a motor vehicle, that is, a gray in color Mercury Grand Marquis, VIN 2MEFM75W3XX600901, that had been transported, shipped and received in interstate commerce, from the person and presence of John Doe, by force and violence, and by intimidation.

In violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2119.

Count 2

On or about April 10, 2022, in San Juan County, in the District of New Mexico, the defendant, **MYLES CORDELLE DAN PADILLA**, knowingly used and carried a firearm, during and in relation to a crime of violence for which the defendant may be prosecuted in a court of the

United States, specifically, carjacking as charged in Count 1 of this indictment, and possessed said firearm in furtherance of such crime, and the firearm was discharged.

In violation of 18 U.S.C. § 924(c)(1)(A)(iii).

Count 3


On or about April 10, 2022, in San Juan County, in the District of New Mexico, the defendant, **MYLES CORDELLE DAN PADILLA**, knowing that he had been convicted of at least one crime punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year, specifically:

- (1) Breaking and entering,
- (2) Battery upon a peace officer, and
- (3) Battery against a household member (fourth or subsequent offense), knowingly possessed a firearm and ammunition in and affecting commerce.

In violation of 18 U.S.C. §§ 922(g)(1) and 924.
